Merton Rise – an update

As promised within the last update in August 2009, it is now appropriate to provide a further update on the progress with the Merton Rise development site. Since the last note the Project Team have been working hard to agree a clear planning strategy with Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, which we hope will culminate in the submission of a new planning application later this year.

In terms of the County Council's vision and aspirations for the site, little has changed and this is reflected in the current masterplan proposals. With this in mind and as part of the agreed planning strategy, we are intending to hold a public exhibition at Everest Community College on the afternoon of Friday 9th and the morning of Saturday 10th July, where details of the current proposal will be available and representatives of the Project Team will be on hand to answer any questions local residents may have. Details of the event will be placed on Notice Boards in schools, community and local centres around Popley. We hope that residents will take advantage of this opportunity to discuss Merton Rise and, on behalf of the Project team, look forward to meeting with you.

Away from the onward planning strategy for Merton Rise, the ongoing management and protection of the development site remains a key responsibility of the Project Team. As mentioned in the previous update, the site has suffered gypsy and traveller incursions and the potential risk is always at the forefront of the Project Team's mind. You will no doubt be aware that we have installed further concrete and earth bund barriers at all the main entry points, which means that all sections of the Spine Road will remain closed to the public for the time being. These barriers are designed to minimise the risk of further encampments, which we acknowledge are of concern to local residents, as well as preventing other anti-social behaviour. We will continue to monitor the situation and have introduced nightly security visits by Kestrel Guards to act as an additional deterrent, but please feel free to report any unusual activity on the site to the County Council in the first instance.

Once again, we look forward to meeting with you at the public exhibition.

Hampshire Domestic Abuse Forum

A new website which aims to help victims of domestic abuse has been launched by Hampshire Domestic Abuse Forum.

The Hampshire Domestic Abuse Forum (HDAF) has teamed up with 'Five by Five People' Southampton based Engagement and Attraction specialists, to create a website that provides a variety of different information on domestic abuse, whether you are a victim or offender, or a friend or family member who knows someone in an abusive relationship.

Domestic abuse can come in many forms, from physical acts such as kicking or punching, to controlling finances and withholding money, or humiliation, enforced isolation and verbal bullying.

The website contains factual information, advice and support, as well as personal stories from people who have escaped abusive relationships, giving access to all information on the many aspects and forms of domestic abuse, including the related subject of Honour Based Violence, and how to get help or provide support.

The HDAF believes that 'tackling domestic abuse is not the responsibility of any single organisation or agency, and success can only be achieved by a true partnership approach'.

Jude Ruddock-Atcherley, who is the Strategic Domestic Abuse Manager for Hampshire County Council, said: "It is estimated that 56,000 women and girls have been a victim of domestic abuse in the last year in Hampshire. We have developed this website to try and help the public and professionals have easy access to information, help and support. Some people are fully aware of the abuse that they are living with on a daily basis and this site will help them to find out the information and agencies which can help them. Other people may not realise that the way they are being treated is in fact abusive and that they have a right to live free from abuse - this site also aims to help them find the information they need and the people who can help them. There is also lots of information aimed at the family and friends of people experiencing abuse, people who are concerned about their own behaviour, children and young people, people experiencing so called 'honour' based violence, and also professionals working with and supporting people everyday."

Detective Inspector Nigel Scott said: "This project represents the commitment of all agencies in the Hampshire Domestic Abuse Forum to provide support for those who are affected by domestic abuse, whether as victims, offenders, relatives or professionals. Talking openly about this issue is a key factor in raising awareness and creating confidence in tackling abusive behaviour, because this is an issue which has a devastating effect on people's lives."

Anti-Social Behaviour?

Everyone wants, and deserves to live in a nice safe area where people get along. Sadly this isn't always the case. The impact of negative behaviour is far reaching and can have a detrimental effect on both individuals and communities. Lives can be affected, the local environment degraded and neighbourhood perceptions wrongly influenced.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is committed to tackling anti-social behaviour and improving public confidence. By working with other agencies, such as the police, fire service, housing associations and many others, the council aims to both deter these acts and hold those responsible to account.

The aim is to ensure that both individuals and communities are protected from future anti-social behaviour and that the person responsible receives the necessary support to enable them to understand the impact of his or her actions and help in changing their behaviour.

If anti-social behaviour is to be tackled and understood it is important that everybody considers the implications of their own actions. Consideration and respect should be afforded to other residents. It is equally important to understand the needs of a diverse community and have a reasonable level of tolerance. If you live in a busy street and feel that children should not play, parking problems should not exist or that noise related issues from neighbours do not occur then your expectation may be unrealistic.

The summer months are upon us as is the World Cup. The number of those enjoying the outside increases and brings with it noise, alcohol, football and other related problems. As a result reports of anti-social behaviour usually rise. Patrol teams will be in areas already known as anti-social behaviour 'hotspots' but reports of emerging issues are vital to help stop problems quickly. To report incidents of anti-social behaviour call Hampshire Constabulary on 0845 0454545 or their non emergency number 101. 








BBQ Safety.





Set up your barbecue on level ground away from bushes, tents or other buildings and do not put it where you have to squeeze past it.

Wear suitable clothing and use appropriate long handled tools.

Make sure the coals are cool before you move the barbecue. Once cool, dispose of the ashes safely - never place them in dustbins.

Keep young children, animals and ball games away from the cooking area.

Be careful when cooking fatty foods, the dripping fat can cause the barbecue to flare up.

Never use petrol or paraffin to start or revive your barbecue. Use only recognised lighters or starter fuel, on cold coals and follow the instructions on the container/packet.

Never leave barbecues unattended.

Summer Fun at Merton Junior




The summer term has so far proved to be as hectic as ever at Merton Junior School.

I have been contacted by debt collectors about money I did owe but have now paid off. They won't accept that the money has been paid. What can I do to stop the phone calls?

If you are approached by a debt collector for a debt you have already paid you should tell them it has already been paid and tell them to take it up with the original creditor.

If you have it, show them proof that you have already paid the debt, but it is up to them to prove that they haven't received payment. Contacting the original creditor to confirm you have paid it and getting them to contact the debt collector would also help, but again it is not your responsibility to do this.

If the debt collector still chases you for the debt you should make a complaint. If they don't resolve the matter and the debt was for borrowing regulated by the Consumer Credit Act — like a credit card, store card or a personal loan - you can ask the Financial Ombudsman to look at the case.

You should also make the Office of Fair Trading (OFT) and the debt collectors trade body – the Credit Services Association – aware of any problems, because chasing people for disputed debts breaches OFT guidelines and the CSA's code of practice.

Don't give in to their pressure. You should not have to pay twice. If you need help seek free, independent advice as soon as possible – go to the Citizens Advice Bureau website www.adviceguide.org.uk for more information and contact details of your nearest CAB.



2010 my husband was out walking our dog along the back of the Merton Schools (Melrose Walk) when a Pit Bull type dog came out of nowhere and attacked our dog. It grabbed our dog's leg and would not let go - at the time my dog was under control, on a lead, the other dog was not. The owner did come over and pulled the dog off but not before the dog had done considerable damage to my dogs leg. The owner of the dog gave his excuse that our dog had growled at his dog, so his dog attacked - our dog was on a lead!

My dog needed immediate veterinary treatment to the substantial wounds on his leg. We have Pet Insurance thankfully,. To call the vet in on a Saturday night was £80. That is without an overnight | responsible and take great care with their stay, a big operation to stitch his leg including muscle that had been damaged, medication and ongoing treatment. As you can imagine, a big expensive vet bill. My dog at the moment is a nervous wreck. He is totally traumatised by the whole incident. We are unable to walk him at the moment due to his injuries.

The Dog Warden was great but she can only do so much without the Police to back her up. The Police seem to be taking to lightly uncontrolable dogs and the owners of these who obviously have no control over them! Thank goodness my dog will live. What if it had been a child? The Police kindly asked the owner to keep

> What is it going to do to make the authorities take charge of these type of owners and their dogs, that are clearly potentially dangerous and out of control! Remembering that a dog does not only leave physical scars there are the mental and emotional scars that remain too.

> The law need to drastically change, and the law taken seriously and acted on by the Police.

> Editor's reply:- This must have been really traumatic for both you and your dog. It is not the first time we have heard of such incidents, and clearly something does need to been done. What is frustrating is the vast majority of dog owners are pets. I am concerned that dogs off leads in fenced equiped play areas could result in a child being hurt. There are signs to say no dogs allowed. I agree that laws need to be more robust and followed through with the full force of the law if people just simply ignore them. Have other readers had problems too?
