

Basingstoke Silver Band

Basingstoke Silver Band has been performing throughout Hampshire and Berkshire for well over a hundred years. In 1898 it started out as the Primitive Methodist Circuit Brass Band who used to march and accompany the Basingstoke Primitive Methodist Church group. Between 1912/14 the band took on more events, all still linked with the Methodist Church, such as processions and outdoor meetings. These were sometimes linked with charitable causes such as putting on a concert to raise money for the Titanic sinking. In 1937, newspaper records show that the band had become The Sarum Hill Methodist Silver Band and was becoming more and more recognized as the town band and playing for processions such as the celebrations for the coronations of George VI and Queen Elizabeth. In 1941 when the Church and the band officially split, the band were taking in non-Methodist players and took on the name of the Basingstoke Silver Band. The band currently play at bandstands throughout the summer, perform concerts yearly in Hook, play for the departing cruise ships in Southampton and play carol concerts in the lead up to Christmas. The band play a wide variety of music from marches, show tunes, classical, hymns and pop music. Why not come along to a park event this summer and support your local brass band? 

- Wear suitable clothing and use appropriate long handled tools.
- Make sure the coals are cool before you move the barbecue. Once cool, dispose of the ashes safely never place them in dustbins.

Dear Friends

One of the very great privileges of my ministry as vicar at St Gabriel's is to be invited into the most cherished and sometimes the most difficult of times for families. March and April proved to be no exception.

In March I was invited to officiate at the funeral of Louise Eames. Louise, as I am sure many of you will know, was the 14-year-old student who tragically lost her life in a road traffic accident outside Costello College. In the ensuing days and weeks following the accident Louise's family conducted themselves with such quiet courage and dignity and in spite of their loss were able to transform the lives of several other people who received Louise's donated organs. Her funeral and the following Memorial Service at St Gabriel's were both wonderful tributes to her short life and the many folk she touched in such a deep and lasting way. This tragic event brought together people of all different ages and backgrounds and throughout there was a very real sense of togetherness of shared grieving with the family.

In April I was invited to officiate at a magnificent wedding for one of our young couples, Jonathan and Rebecca! Folk had travelled far and wide to share their joy and celebrate their love. After the service what a feast we enjoyed. It wasn't just the food though. It was also the sense of family, friendship and fun that pervaded the whole occasion.

Life and death in all its colours of joy and thanksgiving and sadness! For me it was a reminder of what my Christian faith is all about. For we are Easter people! The great sadness of the suffering and death of Jesus is replaced three days on by the joy and celebration of the Resurrection and our hope can rest secure in the knowledge that those sad partings are only temporary and that a greater joy awaits us in heaven.

Jesus said 'I have come that they may have life and life in all its abundance!" And he knew what he was talking about! He too experienced all that it is to be human; he celebrated at a wedding at Cana in Galilee and wept at the grave of his friend Lazarus and in between shared in all our joys and sorrows. Wherever you have been, wherever you are, Jesus knows and has been, and is, there! May you catch a glimpse of the resurrection hope of Easter and may it transform your life.

Childcare expenses and income tax

Where an employer contributes to any form of childcare expenses by giving the employee cash, those cash contributions are taxable as income for all employees. A partial exemption from income tax can, however, apply if the employer pays the childcare provider direct for childcare services without money being paid to the employee; or if the employer providers vouchers which the employee can only redeem for childcare.

Where the vouchers or payment qualifies for a partial exemption from tax, the employee will be taxed on the value of the voucher or the fees paid above a set exempt amount. This exempt amount used to be £55 a week for all employees. However, from 6 April, it will be:

- £55 a week for employees who are basic rate taxpayers, and for employees who are higher or additional rate taxpayers who were already receiving the vouchers or the benefit of the payment before 6 April
- £28 per week if the employee is a higher rate taxpayer and started receiving the vouchers or the benefit of the payment on or after 6 April
- £22 per week if the employee is an additional rate taxpayer and started receiving vouchers or the benefit of the payment on or after 6 April.

Councillors Page: There will be further significant improvements for pedestrians and cyclists in the Popley area. This second phase of the North Popley Accessibility Improvements is planned to commence in the second or third week in June. This is part of the 1.4 million pounds of improvements for road safety. The scheme is focussed on making it easier to travel along Popley Way and Carpenter's Down, as well as to cross the two roads at key locations and the junctions with the side roads.

There has been an emergency extraordinary meeting called in Winchester about the consultation and six million pound cut to the much used and needed SureStart Childrens Centres. I will report back to you in the next Popley Matters. There have been 22,000 collected and presented to the cabinet member in charge of childrens services. I cant remember a bigger petition and it shows the strength of feeling by the residents of Hampshire.

Most people are keeping to the 30mph along Popley Way and Carpenters Down but for those impatient ones that are tailgating and tooting their horns, please remember it is illegal and that there is a sound reason why it was needed to reduce the speed.

On my regular walkabouts I have noticed quite a few walls have been damaged and there has been some fly tipping, all have been reported. If you notice any damage etc you can always contact me.

Popley East: This is a quiet time of the year for council business as all meetings are suspended in the weeks preceding the local elections on 5th May.

Work is progressing on a new combined contract for waste collection with Hart District Council. We have concerns about this as it is a very long contract and does not offer very good value for money. Also there is no substantial commitment to raising recycling rates - Basingstoke's recycling rate of 22% is the worst in the South East and is actually falling, when we should be looking to raise it towards 50%.

The first houses at the Faroe and Maldive regeneration are now occupied and it is only a matter of a few weeks before more houses become available for occupation. The revised shops application is still open to consultation.

We're still unsure about the Forestry Commission sell-off of Basing Wood. The government consultation was aborted but we don't yet know if Basing Wood was in those schemes earmarked for sell-off this year, and if this year's sell-off will go ahead. Andy McCormick Popley East





Question: What rights do grandparents have to see their grandchildren?

Ann Corrigan, family lawyer, replies:

'Grandparents can play a vital role in a child's life, especially for those children who are torn between two

parents', says Ann Corrigan, family lawyer at Phillips Solicitors. 'The sad fact emerging from research suggests that, after a break-up, almost half of grandparents never see their grandchildren again. If you are one of the 14 million grandparents in Britain and you fear losing direct contact with your grandchildren after the children's parents separate or divorce, read on.

At the moment grandparents have no rights of contact with grandchildren when their own children separate, despite the fact that they are increasingly relied upon for help with child care and family finances. There are options ranging from mediation to taking legal action but there's no guarantee of success. It's heartbreaking, not just for the you, the grandparents, but also for the children who may well have depended on you before the parental break up. But don't lose hope.

'Now', says Ann, 'for the first time, separating parents will be expected to ensure grandparents continue to have a role in the lives of their children after they split up. A recent review of the family justice system, commissioned by the government, is recommending that 'Parenting Agreements' should be drawn up that explicitly set out contact arrangements for grandparents which could then be used as evidence in court if a mother or father goes back on the deal. The proposals will now go out for consultation but they are certainly a step in the right direction.'



30mph Speed Limit on Popley Way/Carpenters Down

There have been some emails, phone calls and a letter to Popley Matters commenting about the 30mph restriction on Popley Way and Carpenters Down and the new slip road. I have done some further research and contacted the relevant council officers. The reply I received was "Concerning the speed limit repeater signs, the Traffic Signs Manual from the Department for Transport clearly states you shouldn't use speed limit reminder signs in a 30mph zone with street lights (for example the whole Popley area) as it would be impracticable to place 30mph repeater signs on every road. To do so in some cases, but not others, would result in inconsistency and driver uncertainty. This is therefore prohibited".

"So, we cannot put speed limit reminders in a 30mph zone with street lights, as doing so would invalidate that speed limit and make it unenforceable by the police. It would also create uncertainty for drivers, as on some roads they were being reminded, but on others there was nothing. The street lights themselves are the effective 30mph signs, unless there is another sign telling people otherwise."

He continued "Having spoken with my colleagues in Development Control, I am informed that the filter lane from Popley Way into Carpenter's Down is there to ensure there is sufficient capacity at this junction following the increased demand from Marnel Park, the former John Hunt of Everest site and the future planned developments identified through the LDF process. If there was only a single lane for traffic, both continuing along Popley Way and also serving vehicles turning into Carpenter's Down, the risk is that there would be significant congestion on this important distributor road."

This 30mph is enforceable by the police and if drivers speed down these residential roads they may well find that they could be stopped by the police.

I know that some drivers are impatient and are tailgating and overtaking on the inside as well as the outside, this is annoying, potentially dangerous, and illegal.

Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team Update.

Current Police priorities in Popley

(1) Drug Dealing - drug related activity Abbey Road:

The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel has voted drug dealing and drug related activity in and around Abbey Road as a current core priority due to the effect this behaviour has on our community and our Residents. Recently both PC Carter (Popley West SNT manager) and PC Brindley (Popley East SNT manager) have made high profile arrests relating to drug activity in this area. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team has also assisted other Hampshire Constabulary Officers with issuing and executing «Crack House Closures» throughout Popley where evidence has been obtained highlighting drug related activity in these addresses.

The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team will continue to conduct high visibility patrols in the area of Abbey Road and continue to deal robustly with those found participating in this activity.

If you have any information that could assist the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team with regards to Drug dealers or drug related activity please contact a member of our team on the details below. All information received will be dealt with in the strictest confidence by our team.

(2) Nuisance Motorcycles:

The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods team has received an increase in reports of nuisance motorcycles around the Popley area. The issue of nuisance motorcycles is not exclusive to Popley as other areas of Basingstoke are also suffering from this activity.

I would like to take this opportunity to educate the parents of any youths operating these vehicles or the occupiers themselves of the dangers and consequences that will occur if this behaviour continues.

Riding a motorcycle can be dangerous and those riding them must pass both a practical and theory test in order to safely operate these vehicles. Motorcycles regardless of shape, size and style, can be dangerous if used without proper training and education. motorcycles are not toys and should only be used by those who have the correct licences to do so. This includes Mini-Motos which we are aware many residents posses. Again these motorcycles are not toys and are not designed for children to play on. Serious damage and injury can occur to to both the rider and any other pedestrians in the area if these Mini-Motos are used.

Please remember that a motorcycle can not be used unless the rider and motorcycle are TIMID: **T**ax, **I**nsurance, **M**ot, **I**ndex plate (registration number), **D**riving licence.

To clarify, Mini-Motos are not road legal vehicles and should not be used on roads at all under any circumstances. Proper motorcycles can not be used unless they follow TIMID above. If you are found to ride a motorcycle or Mini-Moto around Popley without TIMID the motorcycle regardless of size, style and legality the following could occur. The motorcycle will be seized and crushed, The rider will be issued with a Section 59 which means if they are caught acting anti-socially in any vehicle including a £200K Ferrari, that vehicle will be seized and crushed regardless of who the owner is. The rider will be summonsed to attend court where they could face charges of no insurance, dangerous driving and improper use of a motor vehicle. The rider could also face a fine, custodial sentence or removal of a driving/provisional licence.

(3) Anti-Social Behaviour in Specklewood Road:

At the moment there appears to be an increase in reported anti-social behaviour in and around Specklewood Road. The anti-social behaviour caused ranges of complaints from noise, parking and nuisance youths from youths. The Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team and our partner agencies will continue to deal with the ASB caused in this area.
