



- •Awareness campaigns through press, talks, articles in newsletters, getting out information for instance through your Popley Matters.,
- •Raising awareness through Adult Services and care agencies when their staff go to a home and see a lot of mail, they may suspect that the person may be a scam victim. Recent close working with Adult Services has enabled us to identify victims.
- •We are aware that postmen and women may know likely scam victims from the amount of mail they deliver. Trading Standards have done a pilot in two areas in Hampshire where the postman delivered a card with the scam mail saying that they are worried that they may be a scam victim and to call Trading Standards.

Although 44 cards were delivered only 5 calls were received, indicating that there were many people we did not reach.

Why we need a change in the law.

Police are aware of where scam mail is coming into the country, but are not able to stop it. Also postal workers know who are the likely victims but are not able to pass on this information. Consequently we are asking for measures to be introduced to -

- •Enable Police or other enforcement officers to intercept mail when it enters the country if they have reason to believe it is scam mail
- •Allow Royal Mail to disclose the details of potential scam victims to us.

What Trading Standards have asked we can all do?

We can be the key 'eyes and ears' in your estates and roads. They ask you to encourage anyone who knows of possible chronic scam victims to get in touch with Trading Standards so that we can offer assistance. Trading Standards are warning about scams

Some common scams include

- Fake lotteries "You've won £1 million but have to pay £50 to release the money". It may sound a reasonable risk to take (relatively little to get so much) but if this money is paid, the demands continue and increase and local residents have lost many £1,000s
- Psychic scams "We will put a curse on you unless you send us £50". This can be immensely stressful for vulnerable residents.
- •"An unknown relative in Nigeria has left you a fortune and you have to pay £250 to release it".

There are many types of scams and most of us throw them away (postal), put the phone down (telephone) or delete (e-mail). However a growing number of residents do fall for them, and will then be targeted again and again – by the same scammer and by others. They are put on a so-called "suckers list"

A Chronic Scam Victim is someone who falls for many scams and believes they are genuine. The scammers are skilled in grooming people to make them believe this, and that relatives are out to stop them getting the money. It can become an addiction and it is extremely difficult for relatives to stop their loved ones replying to scams. As well as the financial consequences (we have cases where residents have lost over £200,000) it also causes loss of confidence, loss of independent living, tension, frustration and conflict for families

Who is likely to become a chronic scam victim?

While all types of people fall for scams, chronic scam victims tend to be older people who live alone. Older, and trusting as they come from an age when they had belief in what people said "if it's in writing it must be true", and they may have no-one to discuss it with.

Why can't scams be stopped?

Most of the scams come from abroad and therefore there is no one based in the UK that trading standards can prosecute or stop from sending out scams. What Trading Standards are doing Page 28

Payment Protection Insurance

There has been an important new High Court ruling about Payment Protection Insurance, or PPI.

PPI is insurance you can take out at the same time as you take out a loan or a mortgage, to cover your your community repayments if you get ill or lose your job. Some people

something separate to the loan they are taking out. This is called mis-selling. Other people have been mis-sold PPI because the policy doesn't cover their circumstances and they would never be able to make a claim on it. For example, they might be self-employed and have been sold a policy which doesn't cover self-employed people.

The High Court ruling means that firms selling PPI will have to review past sales of their policies, even where customers have so far not complained. Firms may need to contact all past and present customers to find out if they want to complain. If you think you were mis-sold PPI, you can complain to the firm which sold you the policy. If the firm refuses to deal with your complaint or to give you a refund for the policy, you can make a further complaint to the Financial Ombudsman Service.

Banks who have sold PPI are working towards contacting customers who may be affected. They advise that if you have already made a complaint, you do not need to do anything. Your bank will be in touch with you as soon as they have processed your complaint. 

Ouestion

Mrs B. asks: I fancy a new build house but my husband wants an old one, so what's best?

Answer:

Zoë Baxter, solicitor at Phillips, answers:

It sounds like you need to do some more talking with your husband before you decide on one or the other! But here are some essentials that you should talk over before going any further. Old properties may have history, charm and character, possibly more space and they may be easier to sell in the future than a new home. But unless your husband is a practical person, you may find you'll have to spend a lot of money on paying people to update your plumbing, wiring, heating and decorations. There can sometimes be restrictive covenants or difficulties with rights of way as well.

For you I suspect the dream is to move into a home that doesn't need any money spent on renovation and that you can move into straightaway. One advantage is that new-build homes do have to be built in accordance with current building regulations, so they will be more energy-efficient and have fewer carbon emissions. If you both decide to go down this route, check the house has a warranty, run by the NHBC, which will protect your money if the builder goes bankrupt after exchange of contract.

Whichever you choose, you'll have to find a deposit and mortgage so get that sorted first. Some developers are offering help with mortgages and deposits, so shop around. Other options include 'shared ownership' where instead of raising a full mortgage on your new home, you can buy part of it and pay a subsidised rent on the other half.

The disadvantages of buying an older property can usually be overcome with time, effort and money but the transaction does usually involve a chain, which a new-build does not, unless you have something to sell as well; so if you need to swing the argument in your favour then the prospect of losing a huge chunk of stress may just help!

Basingstoke Community Transport are now running a weekly bus service, on Mondays, taking residents to Morrisons supermarket, the hospital, rail station and Festival Place.

At the moment this is only weekly and there is a small charge, £3 return with a bus pass, £6 return without. However if this is well used, it will become free of charge and it is hoped to run a service more than once a week.

Review of the Future of Sherborne St John Parish Council

Residents in the rapidly growing parish of Sherborne St John are being asked how they want to be represented at the most local level in future.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is asking all of the people living in the area whether they want to stay with the existing parish council, whether they want it to split in two, or to grow and be renamed. These are some of the options under the process known as a Community Governance Review, which is starting off this month with the council writing to electors.

The move has been prompted by the development of Marnel Park and Merton Rise, both of which are covered at the moment by the parish of Sherborne St John in the Popley Fields parish ward. This has led to parish councillors representing an uneven number of electors - with 1166 in the Popley Fields ward and 993 the Sherborne St John ward of the parish council.

In the first stage of the Sherborne St John parish review, electors are being asked to give their comments on the current situation and the timetable and process for making decisions on whether any changes are needed. Following this consultation, draft proposals are due to be published later in the year for a more formal consultation period. Only if there is a significant desire for change would a ballot of all residents be carried out to give them the option to support or reject any recommendations made. Any changes would come into effect at the scheduled elections for Sherborne St John Parish Council in May 2012.

The borough council's Corporate Director Dorcas Bunton said: "Parish councils play an important role in acting for communities at the local level. Reviews like this give us the chance to make sure that these councils are representative and meet the local community's needs. The first stage of this review is to ask electors whether they think changes are needed."

Carried out under the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007, a review looks at:

- creating, merging, altering or abolishing parishes
- the naming of the parishes or other types of council, such as community or neighbourhood, if they are created
- the number of councillors, wards and other electoral arrangements for any new councils
 - any knock-on effects on borough council wards
 - when any first elections would be held.
