From your Community Safety Patrol Officers

We hope you enjoyed the festive period and would like to wish you a happy new year.

As Community Safety Patrol Officers (CSPO) we identify and tackle local issues, reduce crime, deter anti-social behaviour and deal with environmental crimes, to make residents feel safer and happier about their neighbourhood.

An environmental crime we frequently deal with, particularly following the Christmas break and run-up to spring is incidents of fly-tipping.

Fly-tipping is the 'illegal deposit of any waste onto land or a highway that has no licence to accept it'. Illegal dumps of waste can vary in scale and the type of waste involved.

Tipping a mattress, electrical items or a bin bag full of rubbish in the street causes a local nuisance, and tipping household items and small-scale building or garden waste in open spaces is unsightly and costs the borough a substantial amount to clear away. If you have bulky household items these can either be taken to the household waste recycling centre on Wade Road, or you can arrange with Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council to collect these items for you (an applicable fee will be charged based on your collection requirements). If you know someone who regularly dumps rubbish illegally, we would be pleased to hear from you so we can investigate further.

Road Safety

Wet Roads & Icy Roads: Be extra vigilant during the winter months. Beware of black ice, taking extra care in shaded areas as the sun won't have melted it.

Try to use major roads rather than smaller, quieter roads which might not have been gritted. In wet and icy conditions brake gently to avoid skidding and keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front - give yourself time to react.

Don't forget: the braking distance is twice as far on wet roads and increases 10fold on icy roads!

- Low Sun & Glare: Now the winter is approaching, the sun is lower in the sky and wet roads will reflect glare which can temporarily blind you to potential hazards.
- Dark Mornings & Evenings: Now the clocks have gone back, evenings and mornings are drawing in. Be extra vigilant for pedestrians. As a pedestrian always use a pedestrian crossing where possible. Help others to see you by wearing fluorescent or reflective clothing in poor light conditions.
- Motorcyclists: Look out for motorcyclists. They represent less than 1% of road traffic but account for 18% of deaths and serious injuries and are 40 times more likely to be killed than a car driver.

Top Tip:

Don't use water to defrost windows - warm water can crack the glass and cold water will just re-freeze. Ensure you leave plenty of time to fully defrost your car in the morning. A squirt of WD40 in the door locks will prevent them from freezing.

Councillors Page: My colleague Councillors and I have had many complaints and concerns about the savage cuts that have been made to the bus service across the whole borough. Whilst acknowledging that the Government have reduced the grants for travel by 45% and this of course has meant some hard choices have had to be made, however people being able to get to work, hospital and doctors I believe is a priority. All Stagecoach bus services cease by around 9pm leaving nurses, cleaners and town centre and other staff possibly stranded. Already people are having to change their jobs. There seems to be an assumption that everyone has access to the use of a car and that is a long way away from the truth. The residents in Abbey and Magnolia Court have been cut off in affect from visits to the hospital by bus as Jazz 5 no longer goes to there and the alternative Jazz 4 (9 with its only 2 hours service in the afternoons), does not go up or down Popley Way.

We have started a petition to ask that the County, Borough and Stagecoach work together to find a solution. Stagecoach made £153 million pounds profit in the UK last financial year, this is obscene when people are being left stranded. You can sign the petition in Fastfare or any of the community centres or contact me (details below). If you would like to have a petition to ask your work colleagues, neighbours or friends please contact me.

At full BDBC council on 15th December I proposed a motion and it was passed to go to committee to have a full and frank look at the provision of the bus service to the whole of the area.

Popley West: While out on a ward walkabout I noticed that some of the old street lights were still shining. As these were mostly in people's gardens we wanted to be sure that the interests of the residents was being kept as a priority. We were assured that as they were in the private gardens that officers are currently working to find alternative locations where required and liaise with the residents affected to decide the best way to replace these lights.

Marnel Park and Merton Rise will no longer be in the parish of Sherborne St John. The parish council requested that they be de-parished and after public consultation 63% of residents that answered said they wanted to be de-parished. This means that after April you will not be paying the precept part to the village of Sherborne St John. The decision can be re visited in four years' time. The Village Hall mortgage is now paid up so you should not be charged the extra £1 a month you have been paying up to now. There is a notice by the disabled bays in front of the shops. To inform people that there is a traffic order and if you park there it will be illegal and you could be fined. We also notice that some large delivery vans park in these bays and even across the public path blocking the dropped kerb this makes it very hard for electric buggies and pushchairs to get past. In total we collected five big bags of rubbish. I'm now hoping to hold an annual litter pick in the area, but will be doing this in spring in the future.

Last month saw the first meeting of residents living in the Islands who are interested in forming a residents group. If you couldn't make the meeting but would be interested in joining, please contact me, details below. The next meeting will take place this month, mid January.

I went to see inside some of the new developments at Faroe and Maldive Close last week. They were lovely and I am looking forward to seeing the area finished and welcoming new residents.

Recently I have had several complaints from residents about late buses and route changes in the area. I have arranged a meeting with the bus station manager at Stagecoach to discuss this, and will as usual report back to you. If you have been affected by these changes then please get in touch.

Update on plans for Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Plans are on track to bring together Basingstoke and North Hampshire NHS Foundation Trust and Winchester and Eastleigh Healthcare NHS Trust as Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust in early January 2012.

If all goes according to plan the new organisation will manage hospital services in Basingstoke, Winchester and Andover. It will also continue to provide outpatient clinics at Alton and Bordon community hospitals and other sites.

Its larger size will allow it to maintain specialties that need to serve at least 500,000 people to be really effective (e.g. Major stroke, heart attack and trauma cases), and look at new ways to develop and deliver services as close to home as possible.

Like all NHS Foundation Trusts it will be accountable to the communities it serves through its members and governors.

More than 17,000 local people are already members and new members will be recruited so that people across Hampshire have a real say in how the organisation is run, delivers services, and develops.

Dog Fouling

Dog mess is an eyesore and a health hazard. If you are a dog owner, you have a legal duty to clean up every time your dog messes in a public place. Registered blind people are not required to clean up after their guide dogs. There is also exemption for dog owners on some kinds of public land, including:

• Land used for agriculture or woodlands

- Rural common land
- Land that is predominantly marshland, moor or heath
- Highways with a speed limit of 50mph or more

Most local councils require dog owners to carry a poop scoop and disposable bag whenever they take their dogs out to a public place. Some councils offer free scoops: ask your council's Animal Warden Unit.

Look out for bins marked as dog bins to dispose of your dog bag. If you cannot find a dog bin, then double wrap the dog bag and place it in a normal litter bin.

If your street is littered with dog mess, you can ask your local council to clean it. Councils now have more power to tackle public dog mess under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005.

Legal measures to prevent dog mess are contained in the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act, which repeals Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996, allows local councils and communities to create byelaws relating to dog mess. Visit the Law Search page for full details.

Councils can also issue dog control orders against individual dog owners for offences including allowing a dog to foul a public space.

Councils can issue fixed penalty orders in relation to dog control orders. Where there is no local rate, the fixed penalty is £75.

In very serious cases, magistrates can issue a maximum penalty of £1,000.

PACKETS OF POO: seen in a hedgerow or on a fence near you?

One or two dog owners may be too posh to carry their doggie do-do.

Most know how to deal with poo on pathways, bagging it up to put in bins. But not all, it seems.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council advice is to bin it. Special dog bins are still placed in play parks, but ordinary bins can now be used.

Check with your vet if you want to know why contact with dog poo is not good for you.

Dear Friends

A Happy New Year! It's hard to believe that we're into 2012 already! I do hope that your celebrations all went well and that it brought all you had hoped for. What sort of a year might 2012 turn out to be? We have the Olympics and the European Championships to look forward to in sport. Still much turmoil and unrest in the economy which may lead to more job losses. Weddings, baptisms and funerals will come our way in the natural cycle of things. Hope is important and I wonder what your hopes for the coming year might be? It seems many people would really like to catch a glimpse of what the future holds.

Did you know that 6 out of 10 men and 7 out of 10 women read their horoscopes everyday? No popular newspaper or magazine would dare to neglect them. Combine this with the growth in clairvoyance, mediums, crystal balls, Ouija boards and tarot cards, New Age religions and cults and you see what I mean. Yet none of these channels has ever been proved right more than 5% in their predictions – or put another way they're always 95% wrong. There are two other methods I want to mention briefly:

Deduction from observation is the basic tool of scientific method. There is a technique called futurology that looks at present trends and attempts to project them into the future. So the Bible has achieved what science and spiritualism cannot – that is 100% accuracy. So where should we place our trust?

Whatever your hopes and plans for the coming year I'll be praying that you may discover the eternal hope held out in the message of Christmas and fulfilled at Easter. St Paul wrote: "May the God of Hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Perhaps you might consider making it a New Year's resolution to discover God's plan for your life – you won't regret it!



Warm Home Discount (WHD)

You may be able to get a discount this winter on your electricity bill under The Warm

Home Discount Scheme (WHD). If you qualify under the scheme, you will get an automatic £120 discount on your electricity bill for the winter of 2011/12 as well as the next three winters.

The electricity suppliers involved in this scheme are:

Atlantic, British Gas, EDF Energy, E.ON, Equipower, Equigas, Manweb, M&S Energy, npower, Sainsbury's Energy, Scottish Gas, Scottish Hydro, ScottishPower, Southern Electric, SSE, Swalec and Utility Warehouse.

If your supplier is not listed here, it's worthwhile contacting them to ask whether they will be signing up to the scheme in future, and what alternative help they can provide.

Low-income pensioners - automatically qualify

You will automatically qualify for the discount if you only get the guarantee credit of Pension Credit on the qualifying date, which is 11 September 2011.

If you automatically qualify for the discount, you will get a letter from your electricity supplier confirming this. If you're unsure whether you automatically qualify for the WHD, you can contact your supplier or get advice from an experienced Citizens Advice Bureau adviser.

Other eligible customers - need to apply

Under the WHD, electricity suppliers may also give a £120 discount to some customers who don't automatically qualify. Most suppliers have identified these customers as those who get a means tested benefit such as Income Support or Jobseeker's Allowance **and** who either:

- have a child under 5 or
- get a disability benefit.

However, money for the scheme is limited and some suppliers have set a cap on the number of customers who don't automatically qualify they are prepared to offer the discount. Instead, they are offering it on a first-come, first-served basis.

If you think you may fall into the group of eligible customers who need to apply, you should contact your supplier as soon as possible. Some suppliers may have information and an application form online. Only British Gas has guaranteed that all customers who are eligible under their scheme will receive the WHD as long as they apply before the end of January 2012.

If you're unsure whether you are eligible for the WHD, you can contact your supplier or get advice from an experienced Citizens Advice Bureau adviser.
