

A Merry Christmas and a Happy, Healthy and Prosperous New Year from Natasha Suruntovich (our Belarusian Correspondent) Orsha, Belarus.

Christmas and New Year in Belarus.

Christmas is celebrated in Belarus on the 7th January as this is the Russian Orthodox Gregorian Calendar. A large minority of Belarusians are Catholic and they celebrate Christmas on the 25th of December.

Of the two holidays, New Year is the larger celebration. This is, in part, due to the Soviet communist era when celebrating religious holidays was *not* encouraged!

On Christmas Eve 'Father Frost' delivers presents for the children. He leaves the presents under the Christmas tree. The type of presents 'Father Frost' brings tend to be more practical than the presents our 'Father Christmas' delivers. These presents would be clothes etc.

The Presents that are exchanged at New Year are similar to the kind of presents we give at Christmas.

For both holidays special foods are prepared. Typically, this would include traditional tangerines, red caviar (I keep telling my friends in Minsk that caviar is black! Red caviar is salmon roe, it makes absolutely no difference, it's still red caviar!) and a special salad I won't even attempt to spell!

The most commonly eaten meats are chicken and pork. Occasionally beef is served but other than in the more swish restaurants I have never seen lamb on the menu.

When Natasha was here with me last July, it was the first time she'd eaten lamb.

Councillors Page: A new year has begun and it will be one of big changes in Popley. We had a meeting with the developers, Charles Church and Sentinel, who will be developing phase 3 and 5. We were pleased to see that they had listened to the concerns we had, and there are no buildings higher than 3 storeys, there are 16 allotments and 3 bungalows though we would have liked to see more. We will continue to press for more bungalows in the other phases. The shops will come in the later phases. There is more parking proposed and they have designed out the courtyard system so prevalent in Marnel Park so parking is much more resident friendly. We asked for an exhibition so that residents can see what is being applied for, and they were happy to arrange that for January 17th in Popley Fields Community Ventre from 3:00-7:30pm. We are distributing the leaflet so that as many residents as possible can attend if they want to. You can also view the plans on the Basingstoke and Deane website, the application number is BDB/77170. The outline was approved in 2010 so was a case of working to get the best design and community friendly development as possible. While we wait for the start of this developement we hold our area open to more applications on the few bits of green we have left. We live in Popley and care passionately about the great area with its fantastic people and will always be here to fight for the very best we can get. Popley West: We wish you all a happy and healthy new year. This year will be a tough one for many people and tougher than I have experienced in our nearly fifteen years as Councillors. There are more severe cuts especially to people who have to claim benefits and services for the disabled and vulnerable.

Merton Rise was Hampshire County Council land and was sold to developers . It now moves a step further to being built. You can view the proposed plans for phase 3 and 5 are on the Basingstoke and Deane website. Application BDB/77170 isfor the first 238 dwellings. We have been going through the plans and we will keep you as informed as possible. We Labour Councillors are working together, along with Sherborne St John, as David Wilson Homes have now officially lodged an appeal with the Planning Inspectorate that is against the unanimous decision of the **Development Control Committee to refuse** the applications for an outline for 450 dwellings and the first of the two phases for 200 dwellings in the Kiln Farm Fields.

HWS Befriender Course

Hampshire Wellbeing Services (HWS) is looking for Befrienders who can usually visit the lonely or isolated, or a person who needs support for a few hours per day once a week. Meetings are arranged to suit the person's needs, either at home or at a neutral venue. Unlike professional carers, such associated workers and care agency staff, Befrienders are able to engage at a much deeper level, which often results in a more positive outcome for the client. Having a Befriender can help people to re-connect with their community. Anyone can become a Befriender. They need to: have CRB clearance, receive training and be prepared undertake continual to professional development. Some befriending relationships include social events, creative classes, or the development of self-help groups. In addition, HWS Befrienders can give information, advice and guidance and promote healthy lifestyles. The next 10 day Befriender Course will start on 14th January, ending in February 2013 (5 weeks). Sessions will take place on Mondays and Tuesdays between 9:30am and 2:45pm. Disability Signpost Service

Ever found yourself lost in an unfamiliar area, not knowing which way to turn? That feeling of being lost and vulnerable is familiar to many people who are suddenly affected by disability either personally or through friends and family. It is not always easy to find the right place to go for advice and information and many people are often left feeling alone and isolated. Basingstoke and District Disability Forum is pleased to announce that they are piloting a new Disability Signpost Service that will help guide disabled people, their carers, friends and family to the right source of information and advice. The first session of the pilot was held on 6 November and information was given out on a range of topics including transport, benefits, housing and volunteering. The Signpost Service is being provided by the Forum in conjunction with the Basingstoke Discovery Centre and will be available on the first working Tuesday of the month in the Discovery Centre between 10am and 1:30pm. The next session is on 8th January. If successful, the service will continue throughout 2013 when it is hoped to take it out to other areas of the Borough to reach people who find it difficult to get into Basingstoke. The Disability Signpost Service is being delivered by Disability Forum volunteers and the Forum's Coordinator. The Disability Forum would like to extend its thanks to the Disability Forum members who inspired this initiative and to the Discovery Centre for their generosity in providing the venue and assistance. Empowering Disabled People in Public Life

Disabled people are currently underrepresented in all areas of public life. Empowering disabled people in public life can be a key lever for changing culture and attitudes. It can raise the profile of the different capabilities and strengths of disabled people. Standing for elected office can be a challenging experience for anyone, and particularly so for disabled people. As well as the negative attitudes and assumptions disabled candidates may face, many also incur significant extra costs in their election campaigns as a result of or impairment. Disabled people who have previously been condition prevented or put off from running for elected office, due to the additional costs they face, can now receive financial help to meet these costs from the Access to Elected Office Fund. The Fund was launched by the Government in July to help level the playing field for disabled people who want to become an elected representative. The Fund is an important step forward in increasing disabled peoples' visibility and participation in society. It is hoped that by removing some of the disability-related barriers of standing for elected office, the Fund will help disabled people to realise their potential to contribute to the political environment, putting them in a strong position to influence change on the issues that affect them and their communities. The Fund provides grants that help meet the additional support needs a disabled person has that are associated with their disability. If this support were not provided, a disabled person may face an additional barrier in the selection and campaign processes compared to a non-disabled person. Sentinel homes get a new look for the New Year

The appearance of Sentinel homes, surrounding our Popley Islands regeneration area, will be greatly improved in the New Year thanks to an extensive, exterior makeover.

Following on from the asbestos surveys, which took place in December, Sentinel homes will be transformed with the addition of thermal, through-colour render to brickwork, the replacement of the white cladding with a modern composite cladding material, the repair of gutters and drainage pipes and the replacement of bin cupboard doors.

The new design will look something like this:



Internal works will include increasing loft insulation, which should lead to lower energy bills and, where necessary, removing redundant water tanks from lofts.

The works are expected to start in January 2013, with several properties being completed every two to three weeks.

Homeowners will also have the opportunity to have their homes improved in the same way. This will be a private arrangement with our contractor, but we can still help and advise you through the process. Hitting the Cold Spots Warms the Hearts

Cold weather not only makes life uncomfortable but can also lead to serious health problems such as respiratory diseases, asthma, depression, heart disease and strokes. Hampshire County Council's 'Hitting the Colds Spots' scheme is building on last year's initiative with another campaign targeted at older and vulnerable people who may struggle to keep warm and pay the bills during the cold winter months.

Older and vulnerable people of any age can 'fall beneath the radar', because they are unaware of the range of options available or find it difficult to access help. Hitting the Cold Spots aims to give them immediate and practical advice on reducing energy bills, increasing available income and keeping warm. This advice is available through a free advice line (0800 804 8601). Depending on the situation, further help may also be on offer with free home visits by Hitting the Cold Spots advisors, access to efficient, oil-filled radiators and grants to assist with hot water and heating repairs using Buy With Confidence traders. In addition, information packs on how to keep warm at home are available via local voluntary community organisations - these include a room thermometer, cosy snood, children's activity pack and useful information.

The scheme, funded by the Department of Health, has already helped 300 Hampshire residents this year with issues such as switching to a cheaper energy tariff, accessing grants to cope with winter fuel emergencies, debt and benefit advice tailored to individual circumstances and assessment for mains gas connection. A third of these callers benefited from a further follow-up visit to their home by a Hitting the Cold Spots advisor who was able to offer them practical assistance with obtaining heating and hot water repairs. One of the advantages of the scheme is that it provides a one-stop shop for many different problems which together may seem insurmountable for an individual. As one satisfied customer from Gosport said about the Hitting the Cold Spots advisor's help, "He sorted everything out. I would have been overwhelmed by it."

Councillor Felicity Hindson, Executive Member for Adult Social Care at Hampshire County Council said:

"I'm very pleased that our Hitting the Cold Spots scheme is helping people to keep warm and addressing winter fuel poverty among older and vulnerable people. The scheme offers a dedicated free advice line with a 'real person' to speak to who can give immediate, practical advice and follow up on the tougher problems.

"When people have had long-term problems with their heating systems or with paying their energy bills it can sometimes take a lot of courage to make that first call and it is encouraging that more and more people are finding the confidence to call our energy advisors."

Road Safety.

Wet Roads & Icy Roads: Be extra vigilant during the winter months. Beware of black ice, taking extra care in shaded areas as the sun won't have melted it.

Try to use major roads rather than smaller, quieter roads which might not have been gritted. In wet and icy conditions brake gently to avoid skidding and keep a safe distance from the vehicle in front - give yourself time to react.

Don't forget: the braking distance is twice as far on wet roads and increases 10-fold on icy roads!

- Low Sun & Glare: Now the winter is approaching, the sun is lower in the sky and wet roads will reflect glare which can temporarily blind you to potential hazards.
- Dark Mornings & Evenings: Now the clocks have gone back, evenings and mornings are drawing in. Be extra vigilant for pedestrians.
 As a pedestrian always use a pedestrian crossing where possible. Help others to see you by wearing fluorescent or reflective clothing in poor light conditions.
- Motorcyclists: Look out for motorcyclists. They represent less than 1% of road traffic but account for 18% of deaths and serious injuries and are 40 times more likely to be killed than a car driver.

Top Tip:

Don't use water to defrost windows - warm water can crack the glass and cold water will just re-freeze. Ensure you leave plenty of time to fully defrost your car in the morning. A squirt of WD40 in the door locks will prevent them from freezing.

Foodbank

Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from redundancy to receiving an unexpected bill on a low income. In 2011-12 foodbanks fed 128,687 people nationwide, 100% more than the previous year. Rising costs of food and fuel combined with static income, high unemployment and changes and delays to benefits are causing more and more people to come to foodbanks for help. At the beginning of October, the Basingstoke Foodbank opened its doors on Wednesday and Fridays to provide emergency food aid to local people in crisis. Based at the top of Sarum Hill, the foodbank is part of the managed process of helping people out of crisis by providing emergency food and support when people need it most. People will be referred by front line agencies including Citizens Advice Bureau, Money Lifeline, Basingstoke and Deane Adult Services, Health Visitors and Social Services using a preauthorised voucher system. More than 30 churches from the Basingstoke area have signed up to support the initiative. This harvest they also had generous support from 20+ schools and local companies and have 25+ referring agencies who are now issuing vouchers to their clients. They do have enough food stock for the rest of this year but are looking to place collection points in local businesses, offices and shops where staff and the public will be able to donate non-perishable foodstuffs. They are also looking for local businesses to support the initiative by contributing towards their ongoing costs including transport and premises, and in the future help with the costs of the part time administrator. The New Year - A Challenging **Time for Some Couples**

Christmas holidays are over but the New Year can be one of the most challenging times for a troubled

relationship. Many couples whose marriages have reached breaking point may have stayed together for one last Christmas for the sake of their children. It is a sad fact that more relationships break down in the New Year than at any other time. The current economic situation is adding to the stress for many and money worries can push a relationship to breaking point. The first week after children return to school in January is very often one of the busiest for starting divorce proceedings.

The breakdown of any relationship is painful for everyone involved and there are also many couples experiencing heartache who are not married – these are co-habitees living as a married couple and they are equally likely to separate but these relationship breakdowns do not show up in the statistics. Separation for such couples is equally complicated, especially if children or property are involved, because co-habiting couples have different rights and responsibilities.

Couples don't always have to go through costly court proceedings, however, as there are cheaper, alternative ways of finding a more amicable resolution, such as Mediation. The courts are increasingly advising couples to use this service, as it can provide a more beneficial and less acrimonious way of finding a solution that both partners agree on. Most important, it can enable a couple to have an ongoing relationship afterwards and in most cases this is vital if children are involved.

Welfare Reforms

The Government's welfare reforms propose changes to the level of benefits and the way they will be paid from 2013.

If you or any member of your household claims any of the following benefits you will be affected:

- Housing Benefit
- Income Support
- Job Seekers Allowance
- Employment Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credits
- Child Tax Credits
- Disability Living Allowance
- Pension Credits

Final guidance on how these changes will affect residents in receipt of benefits is expected soon but proposals include:

Social housing changes

If you are a social housing tenant, are under the qualifying age for State Pension Credit and have a spare bedroom your housing benefit will be cut from April 2013.

Council Tax Benefit

If you currently receive support to pay your Council Tax this could change from April 2013.

Capping benefits

If you are unemployed the government will assess your benefits and cap the amount you receive to £500 per week for single parents and couples with or without children. For single people without children the cap is £350 per week.

Universal Credit

From October 2013 a new Universal Credit will be phased in. Instead of claiming several types of benefit you will claim just one, covering all current benefits.

Advice and guidance

Those people affected by the changes will be informed as soon as more detail is known. A free fortnightly drop-in advice service is held at the borough council offices. The council is also working with the housing associations to look at additional ways to give people support and advice

Need Help?

Residents affected by the welfare reform or in need of money advice can attend a free fortnightly drop-in advice service held at the Council Offices between 10am and 2pm.
