

Councillors Page: Persimmon Homes, who now own the Merton Rise developement site, achieved Reserved Matters approval to Phases 3 and 5 on 6th June 2013. This approval follows on from the outline planning permission the County Council obtained in January 2012. These two phases relate to the land parcels to the western edge, A340 side, of the site and will enable the developer to enclose the site, while they look to deliver the remaining parcels through the life of the planning consent. In terms of the other phases, and with particular reference to the Local Centre, Phase 2 is likely to be delivered in 2015 at the earliest. There is provision in the Section 106 agreement, attached to the outline planning consent, for the Local Centre (shops) to be constructed before 400 dwellings have been occupied on site, which is to ensure delivery of this element. For Phase 4, which borders Popley Community Park, this is now likely to be underway early to mid 2014, with Phase 6, adjacent Don Allen Drive, late 2015/early 2016. Popley West: Your Popley Labour Councillors have been meeting with Hampshire County Council with regard to future section 106 money to be spent on roads and paths in the Abbeys and Poets estates. It is in the early stages but once the Popley Islands new access scheme is completed the next phase will be Poets and Abbeys.

We continue to request that the administration at least meet with Councillors to discuss the Costa Coffee issue. We cannot see how we, the tax payers, should subsidise a company that has made millions of pounds of profits and we are enduring more and more cuts to services.

There is a consultation at the moment on the bus services and you can fill in the questionnaire on line on the Basingstoke Council site Basingstoke.gov.uk or request a leaflet phone 844844. If you think there should be a better/later evening service or links from Popley East to West now is your chance to let the powers that be know.

We are pleased at last that the delivery of a post box in the Marnel Park/Merton Rise is one step nearer and we should have one installed in the next few months.

CIIr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 CIIr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 **Popley East:** We expect a decision from the inspector regarding the appeal by David Wilson Homes to build 450 houses on Kiln Farm, in September.

Your Popley Councillors are in discussion with County Highways regarding improvements to the road and footpaths. In respect of Popley East we have commented that the following should be prioritised and concentrated on at Shakespeare Road: traffic calming measures (main priority for funding): off road parking provision for additional spaces: subway improvements; pedestrian access improvements to paddling pool area in Chineham Park; and crossing improvements at the One Stop shop and subway. We are happy to receive comments from residents about the Popley East area improvements. The council is seeking comments from the public on bus routes funded by the Council. Some of the routes directly affect Popley East. For example the Jazz 3 services after 7pm are directly funded by the Borough Council solely or in conjunction with Hampshire County Council. June has been another sensational month for MFC Popley Youth, the area's local children's football club. Following on from the enormous success at the club's tournament in May, where the club won three of the six competitive trophies on offer, comes more exciting news on various fronts.

At the tournament, an event now that is so high profile it attracted scouts from Chelsea, Fulham, Southampton and Reading football clubs over the two days; first comes news that three of the Club's Under 7s were invited to train with Chelsea FC at one of their outlets.

And following on from that comes the news that Oliver Turner, who is about to become an Under 9 on 1st July, has been scouted to join League One

Crawley Football Club's Academy. This is a great achievement for Oliver and also reflects well on the club (who also produced D'Andre Brown who is still with Reading going into U13s) and particularly Oliver's coaches, Andrew Williams and David Gambrell, who have worked so very hard to develop him as a player these past two seasons.

Finally, the club can now announce that, following work behind the scenes by Ian Davies, Club Chairman, and Nicci Gambrell, Club Welfare Officer, the Club has secured a £5,000 Grow The Game grant from The Football Foundation over the next three years. This will provide massive benefit to the children as the club continues to expand. Next season the Club will have teams in all age groups from Under 7s to Under 15s and the Club will also be launching a "Future MFC Players" nursery, that will be hosted by Warwick Sear-Jarvis, who holds the FA Level 3 full UEFA B professional coaching badge.

The club now also its regular 'Total Football' Children's Holiday Camps. These will take place throughout the summer holidays at Everest Community College, hosted by Club Chairman Ian Davies.

Basingstoke Foodbank

Every day people in the UK go hungry for reasons ranging from food banks fed 128,687 people nationwide, in 2012/13 we anticipate this 1000 bank number will rise to over 290,000. Rising costs of food and fuel combined with static income, high unemployment and changes and delays to benefits are causing more and more people to come to food banks for help.



In these days of economic cut-backs and austerity, there is no shame when someone falls on hard times through circumstances beyond their control, and it takes courage for them to decide to prioritise keeping their loved ones warm and housed, over putting food on the table. Basingstoke Foodbank is operated by a group of local churches and holds emergency food supplies to help such people for a few days, giving them time to find longer term answers to the situation they find themselves in. Based at the top of Sarum Hill, the Basingstoke Foodbank is part of the managed process of helping people out of crisis by providing emergency food and support when people need it most. People are referred to us by front line agencies using a pre-authorised voucher system, and the vouchers can be exchanged for three days of food (equivalent to nine meals) for however many people are in the family.

If you know of anyone who is facing such a crisis, do encourage them to make use of this resource. This can be done by contacting one of the support agencies in town who can issue Foodbank vouchers - these include the Citizen's Advice Bureau, Social Services, Money Lifeline (free debt counselling service), and many others, depending on the particular issues involved. Alternatively the Foodbank can be contacted for advice on 07722 673645 during opening hours, which are 10.30am to 2.30pm, Wednesdays and Fridays.

First of all, I'd like to say hello to the people of Popley. PC Dan Carter mentioned me in the previous issue of Popley Matters, however here goes, my name is Steve Burgess and I am the new Police Community Safety Officer for Popley East, together with Dan and PCSO Addison Maker we form your Safer Neighbourhood Team. I've been working on the Popley beat since 22nd April of this year and have already met some key individuals which make up your community. However, I am sure there still are plenty of you who I have yet to meet. If you do see me out and about (normally on

my bike), please feel free to stop me, say hello, introduce yourself and let me know of anything that is of concern in your area.

I have recently been working alongside Everest Academy Year 8 groups, interacting with pupils and giving presentations on Anti-Social Behaviour, the affects it has on individuals as well as communities. So far the feedback has been good, and myself and Everest are looking to branch this involvement with police out to Year 9 as well.

We have continued to concentrate our patrols around your priorities, On 8th June whilst on patrol I encountered a male smoking cannabis in the Montserrat Road area. He was detained where an officer attended and dealt with the male by means of an £80 fine. Other than that, myself, Dan and Addison have targeted our patrols around known areas and have not encountered any issues. We have received a number of calls from residents of Aspire Place expressing concerns for bin sheds to the rear of the flats, in particular youths breaking in the sheds and congregating within them. We have advised Sentinel of this and asked if they could look in to securing the bins more appropriately.

Football games still appear to be an issue in and around the area of Abbey Road, a number of complaints have been received revolving around this. We all continue to patrol the area, and have offered words of advice to anyone playing football in the street. Please can we remind all parents there are plenty of fields and play parks in and around Popley where football would be more suitable and they can play stress free.

Cracking down on ASB

In the past year, cases of anti-social behaviour (ASB) across Basingstoke have dropped in the following areas by:

Oakridge - 33.5%
Old Basing - 7.4%
Popley East - 10.5%

Popley West - 13.6%

Rooksdown - 9.1% Winklebury - 8.7%

There's been a slight rise in Chineham of 3.3%, but overall the number of ASB cases is down by 14.8%.

Taking action against noisy neighbours

Sometimes making the odd bit of noise at home is unavoidable, if you're doing the housework or DIY. However, some people make such a persistent noise that it disturbs their neighbours and makes their lives a misery. In these cases Sentinel will take action. Here's some examples

Case 1 - A noisy neighbour in Basingstoke was continually playing music and causing low level ASB.

Action taken - Several warnings were issued, but the behaviour continued. We agreed to help and support them and they agreed not to play loud music. They broke this agreement, so we've applied to court to end their tenancy.

Case 2 - A noisy neighbour in Basingstoke continually played loud music throughout the day and evening. The music was so loud we received complaints from five neighbouring homes.

Action taken - Warning letters were issued and an interview was completed, but despite this the music continued. During a party a serious incident took place in the property. We issued a notice and started proceedings to evict the tenants. This case is going to trial.



The Court of Protection and Deputyships

The Court of Protection makes decisions and can appoint Deputies to act on behalf of people who are unable to make decisions about their personal health, finance or welfare. For example, this will be the case if a Lasting Power of Attorney has not been put into place before a loved one has lost their mental capacity.

A common situation concerns anyone looking after a family member who has Alzheimer's, Dementia or an aged related

mental health issue. This can be one of the most challenging tasks and sadly with an aging population, many of us will face this at some point.

In many cases, there comes a time when a loved one can no longer look after themselves and requires residential or nursing care. The average cost of care can be in the region of £1,000 per week. State Assistance is available through your local authority, but they are only obliged to pay the full cost of residual care if your total worth (including your home) is less than £14,250.

Getting access to a loved one's pension(s), bank accounts and other monies is essential in the event that they have to pay for their care. Hopefully they will have a Lasting Power of Attorney in place so that you can deal with their property and financial affairs straight away. Once a person loses their mental capacity they cannot make a Lasting Power of Attorney – you will not be able to make the Power on their behalf!


In these circumstances the only option will be to apply to the Court of Protection to become their Deputy. The Court of Protection has been set up with the sole purpose of dealing with applications for those who have lost mental capacity. The majority of applications to the Court relate to a person's property and financial affairs which can involve running their bank account, selling their home, collecting their pension and ensuring the bills are paid. The Court can also grant orders in respect of that person's health and personal welfare, Statutory Wills and Enduring or Lasting Powers of Attorney.

Applying to the Court can be a difficult and lengthy process as it is laden with many rules and

procedures. Please remember that applying to the Court should always be seen as a last option and not a substitute for making a Lasting Power of Attorney.

If you asked one of the towns folk where is Bramley (as we did one day) "Ohh it be only up yee road." Boy did we walk that day Never again did we ask that question. On saying that I did get caught out again in Edinburgh. We were going back to Penrith when we got lost. My mate stopped the car and said "Look, ask that taxi driver." So muggins goes over to ask how we get out on the road south. As he started to talk, my jaw dropped as I could not understand a word. Her Indoors, my friend, and his wife were crying with laughter as I crossed the road back to them. I got in the car closed the door they still did not stop, "Okay what way do we go then?" they asked me. All I could say was "See you Jimmy, down there." No offence to our Scottish friends among you, well I think that is what he said. Her Indoors could dine out every night about that day, all I can remember was "See you, Jimmy," then blank.

I remember when I was about ten years old my friend and I had been to the rec. We were sitting on a bench watching some cricketers training when a young policeman came up to us and said "How long have you been in the area? In all innocence I said" All our live's; He grabbed hold of me and said "I do not want lip from you." I replied I am not". He then said we robbed the phone box. Then it was the old penny box phones and he made us empty our pockets. We were innocent. He told us to clear off home and we did. Now my father was a big, big man back then and we told him what had happened, with that on went his coat and off to the small police station we went. Dad knew the Sergeant well and when dad saw him the usual greetings passed between them and dad asked when this police officer would be back to the station "Any time now George" he said. As he said it he walked in, dad turned around and lifted this policeman off his feet. He turned very white. The sergeant came round from the back of the desk and pleaded with dad to put him down. Dad did, straight on his backside. Dad then had a chat to the sergeant and he said "Leave him with me to deal with George, I will sort him out". Some days later he came round and said he was sorry. Many years after we had become very close friends with him and you would often see us up the rec playing cricket or a kick about with him, and he was in his uniform. Would you do that now? I know that if a policeman were to do it to one of my children I would be the first to have a chat with him. Children should

look up to our police as protectors not aggressors. Children and youths should be respectful when out. Do not go around, smashing people's property with lumps of wood. They knocked the corner of our front wall down and the boy was only about 10-12. I, with my failing health, have enough to deal with and this only gets me down. Whoever they were they don't want to mix with Her Indoors-well I certainly wouldn't.
