

Councillors Page: CIIr Paul Frankum and CIIr Jane Frankum met with officers of Hampshire County Council and Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council and as a result of the meeting the council are seeking to implement on-street parking controls in Marnel Park following concerns about parking behaviour reported by local residents and the police. Detailed parking surveys have been carried-out which show where vehicles parked at junctions, on bends and footways that are causing difficulties for both traffic and pedestrians. In response it is intended to promote some double yellow line (No Waiting At Any Time) parking controls at locations along the main traffic routes through Marnel Park to improve road safety and access for all road users. It is proposed to introduce the parking controls later this year on an experimental basis initially for six months, to enable their effectiveness to be assessed before considering introducing them permanently. The six month experimental period will provide an opportunity for the public to comment on the parking controls and all representations that are received will be taken into consideration prior to deciding whether the controls should be made permanent. Popley West: We are very concerned about the amount and type of rubbish and damage being done in the Marnel Park area. There are two main sites one owned by David Wilson Homes (The Copse) and the open green area behind Marnel Lodge. In both areas BBQs and small fires have been started and left. The fire service are having to attend and this takes them away from the fire station and could mean extra time on a journey if there were a major fire. 19 fire fighters were killed attending a grass fire in America. It has been a dry and hot summer and what seems like a bit of fun could escalate here. The rubbish is food stuff and alcohol, please do enjoy the lovely open area but take your rubbish and dispose of it at home.

Cllr Paul Frankum has been walking around Popley Abbeys and reporting back to highways department where there are slab paths that need replacing with tarmac, where there is no path at all and a clear need to have pathways, for instance to bus stops and shops.

Cllr Paul Frankum 01256 819924 Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 Page 4 Popley East: At the end of June, work started on the access improvements in Popley Islands. Footpaths are being upgraded, with the old concrete paving being replaced with a modern durable surface. The work is expected to take about 20 weeks, and will be completed at the end of September. At times, some sections of footway will have to be closed while work is in progress. In order to shorten the construction time and reduce the period of disruption overall, materials will temporarily stored at sites prior to usage. Any disruption to parking should be shortlived as the works move to a different location. Further information can be found on http://www3. hants.gov.uk/transport-schemes-index/northpopley.htm The next phase of improvements will be in the Popley Poets area concentrating on traffic calming measures in Shakespeare Road and to investigate the provision of off road parking in the area. After receiving a number of concerns from residents it is also hoped that improvements can be made to the approach to the subway from Shakespeare Road.

Quotes are now being sought for the work at The Dell, based on the idea of standing stones engraved with words, which has proved the most popular option with residents. It has now been decided to go forward with the idea of lines of poetry related to the Poets Estate being engraved into the stones. It would be great to hear from local residents and school children living in the Popley Poets of their thoughts on what lines of poetry should be used.

However, reports of football nuisance in and around Abbey Road as well as criminal damage around Aspire Place have declined, and although these have now been removed from our immediate priorities, we will continue to monitor and patrol these known issue areas and remind all residents to report any problems via 101. Now all the schools have broken up, can I once again remind all parents that small communal gardens are inappropriate for balls games, please could you urge your children to play in the many parks available in and around Popley.

The panel has also agreed two new priorities. These are: Trespassing in Marnel Park Schools and Anti Social Behaviour in the park and wooded area behind Carter Drive, in particular the lighting of fires in the wooded area. Your Safer Neighbourhood team aim to patrol these areas as best we can in order to tackle these issues. In order to help us tackle this issue it is important that any resident witnessing any issue calls 101 in order for us to deal with and gather a greater understanding.

In other news, we are aware of the issue which travellers caused over the past month, leaving a trail of rubbish and much more. Anyone witnessing any travellers setting up are reminded to ring the police as soon as possible. On the 22nd June PC Dan Carter carried out a successful drugs raid in the Marnel Park area, a large amount of Cannabis plants were found, and a male is currently on bail for this. A car was stopped on 19th July in Falkland Road by police officers and a male was found in possession of cannabis, the man was arrested and charged with possession. On the 23rd of this month I stopped one male in possession of cannabis, officers attended and the male was given a street caution.


97 children aged between 8 and 18 attended the workshops and produced 77 auditionees for a final cast of 47.

Please do not invite crime

Unfortunately in the last few days I have had reports of 'Opportunist Crimes' particularly targeted at the elderly and other residents, who had left their front door open during the very hot weather. In one case, the resident found the intruder going through her handbag and, when challenged, said he was looking for window cleaning work. Fortunately, in cases reported so far, nothing has been stolen and nobody has been injured, but PLEASE - PLEASE do not invite this sort of crime – always keep your doors and windows secure.

May I ask all coordinators, members and neighbours to be extra vigilant in the current hot weather. Be a good neighbour, especially where vulnerable residents are concerned.

Also, do not leave valuable items in your car when parking. Items left on view are all too easily stolen in seconds.

Hot off the press and new issues

I have updated the BDNW website with information about Yellow Pages deliveries and Rogue Trader announcements, so do please take a look at those articles. Police Twitter feeds are already in place and Facebook links should be coming soon. There is also an issue with catalytic converters being stolen at night, mainly from Mercedes Sprinter vans. It is difficult to stop this type of crime and some companies are switching vehicle supplier to try to alleviate the issue. Please be extra careful when parking any vehicle overnight and do please report any issues straight away on 101 or 999 as appropriate.

Younger members

Neighbourhood Watches everywhere are continually trying to attract younger members and various initiatives are being tried. We are open to all suggestions as to how we might actively encourage young persons to become involved and take an active part in the work we do. If you have any ideas that you think might work or help in this area, then do please let us know.

Traveller camps

We currently have travellers camps in the borough area and it may well be that some incidents are related to their arrival. Our Police are taking action to remove these camps but, as we all know, that takes time. Please be extra vigilant in all areas of our borough and report any traveller instances to 101 so that eviction proceedings can be instigated at the earliest opportunity. Also do not encourage their presence by "employing them for odd jobs at bargain prices". If there is no financial incentive in an area, maybe they will go elsewhere, hopefully well outside of our area.

Project Hermes

A new crime fighting system is being promoted by Basingstoke Police whereby valuable item details may be scanned in to a central database to record their rightful owner. Police Officers can check virtually instantly if items found in suspicious circumstances are stolen.

Hermes uses "Immobilise", so before your phone, bike, computer or any other personal item is lost or stolen, you can use Immobilise to instantly tell police, insurers, and the second-hand trade. These actions help greatly in the recovery of your property and capture of thieves. BDNW is considering training on the Hermes/Immobilise kit. Meanwhile, you may wish to take a look at the website at http://www.immobilise.com/ for further information. New updates should be coming soon.

Nominated Neighbour Scheme

Hart & Rushmoor SNT Officers are now actively trialling this scheme, which is supported by Neighbourhood Watch, with the aim of helping to protect elderly and vulnerable in instances of unknown doorstep callers. Further details are on the BDNW website. We hope it will come to our area fairly soon.

Ongoing crime issues. – the old favourites still happen

There are several witness appeals on our website this week, relating to recent crimes in our area. Please take a look. Also on our website is an article about supermarket car park scams. Please do be careful.

Opportunist theft from all types of motor vehicles is unfortunately still happening, especially in rural areas like beauty spots, rural restaurant car parks and any similar areas. This is mainly being fuelled by valuable items being left visible and inviting crime. The police often undertake major crime prevention initiatives and you may get a letter from them, if their patrols reveal you are thought to be leaving your vehicle and valuable contents at risk. Also ongoing is thefts from vans in many areas of the Basingstoke patch. Where possible, please remove or hide all valuable items from your vehicle, especially when parked overnight. Do remember that thieves know where to look for your valuables and it just takes seconds for a thief to rob you of your most treasured items. NEVER leave keys in your vehicle when it is not being driven and always lock it when parked and don't leave any items on view.

Always remember that the issues from previous editions never go away. We are always aware of Rogue Traders offering their services heating oil thefts, cold callers, other scams and frauds etc. Again – see articles on the BDNW Website

Also be aware of any "extra devices" designed to skim your details, when using your credit/debit card at cash machines, petrol pumps and other outside card facilities. If it looks strange or different, don't use the card machine, but do report it ASAP.

Every piece of information really does help the overall fight against crime. Every call can also help in deciding policing strategy.



A song-worm has invaded my brain, it's that old Irving Berlin song "we're having a heatwave, a tropical heat-wave, temperatures rising it's hardly surprising...." Phew! What a scorcher it's been so far and don't you just love it? Well I do, so I'm always a little disappointed to hear folk complain about the weather. I was watching Billy Connolly on TV the other night he was saying that there is no such thing as bad or good weather - only the wrong clothes! How right he is, but having said that it does seem to be an English national pastime to comment on the weather doesn't it! When we lived in Cyprus no one ever talked about the weather, mostly because the sun shone every day from early April to late October - you could plan a barbeque a month in advance and know the weather would be good – bit boring really – I do like the unpredictability of the English weather.



Important Changes to the School Leaving Age

This summer has brought important changes to the school leaving age. Those who will reach age 16 before the end of the current summer holidays were allowed to leave school at the end of last term.

They were then free to take up employment if they wished to.

The new rules in force from this summer mean that those in year 11 will not be able to leave the education system until they are 17 and those in year 10 and below will have to wait until they are 18 before they finish their education. This is an initiative by the Government to keep young people in education or training longer and to encourage an increase in apprenticeships and training opportunities.

It will not be necessary for students to actually stay at school and if they prefer they can as an alternative, go to college, take up an apprenticeship or take up full-time employment (over 20 hours per week) combined with part-time education or training. This means that employers will hopefully be looking seriously into setting up training schemes and apprenticeships going forward.

This is just one of a number of changes that came into force this summer and which affect employment and the laws that relate to it. Those changes include the revision of the Employment Tribunal rules, a change to the redundancy provisions and amendments to the rules on whistle blowing and dismissal due to political opinion. It also saw the introduction of "protected conversations" in the workplace leading potentially to settlement agreements as a means of ending employment on agreed terms.

BBQ Safety.

- Keep a bucket of water, sand or a garden hose nearby in case of emergencies.
- Only use barbecues in suitable and safe areas.
- Set up your barbecue on level ground away from bushes, tents or other buildings and do not put it where you have to squeeze past it.
- Wear suitable clothing and use appropriate long handled tools.
- Make sure the coals are cool before you move the barbecue. Once cool, dispose of the ashes safely never place them in dustbins.
- Keep young children, animals and ball games away from the cooking area.
- Be careful when cooking fatty foods, the dripping fat can cause the barbecue to flare up.
- Never use petrol or paraffin to start or revive your barbecue. Use only recognised lighters or starter fuel, on cold coals and follow the instructions on the container/packet.
- Never leave barbecues unattended.
