

Councillors' Page: Hampshire County Council are consulting on scrapping all of the Borough Councils in the county and creating a mega-council based in Winchester. Fill in the form to let them know what you think; http://www3.hants.gov.uk/servinghampshire. I have huge concerns about this, as it would take away local knowledge and democracy. Who knows Basingstoke and Deane better the people who live and work here, or people who are living miles away in the New Forest or by the coastline?

Look what the county has done so far; cut our local Children's Centres from eleven to one, and the one they are keeping isn't even on a bus route; cut the hours for residents to go to the tip, plus they now want to charge you for a whole range of waste!; Spraying weeds by HCC is due to be reduced to once a year leaving Basingstoke and Deane to pick up the areas around our highways; youth workers have been reduced; adult social care workers cut; care for elderly cut; buses cut; and libraries cut, but your Council Tax has actually gone up this year by £50 on average.

We deserve better and that's why we are #STANDINGUP4BASINGSTOKE. We want Basingstoke and Deane to run local services as a Unitary Authority local services that are run from a Council accountable to you. Cllr Jane Frankum 01256 819924 email jane.frankum@hants.gov.uk

Popley West: There have been a lot of complaints about the gas replacement works and looks like they will be here for months. The utilities can seem to do what they please and sometimes without a thought for the disruption. I had the water cut off with no notice when they again went through the pipes. Records of where the pipes and other utilities were placed were not recorded at all, or quite often wrongly done. Holes have been left for weeks for no apparent reason. I know sometimes they have to work late as they have to get the gas supply back on as soon as possible after having to cut it off to install the new supply to each household, but it is annoying when it can be up to 10:30 at night. There is no immediate news as yet on the next phase for Popley Community Park. I am hoping that we should soon have more news and then a public consultation where residents will have a say in what is put there in the way of equipment and landscape.

The underpass by Don Allen Drive will not be filled in as it will become a major pedestrian route to the new shops later in phase six and a safe crossing to the school and town centre.

Some areas within the site are either not being maintained or are not being carried out to a standard we would expect.

As there are actually six different agencies involved, not including the developers, we arranged for a site meeting with all parties which proved to be very helpful. Areas were identified that have no maintenance schedule in place so this will now be rectified and other areas will be brought up to standard. We will keep you updated.

We are pleased to report that the Chineham Park Splash Pad continues to attract many visitors, in fact numbers are exceeding expectations. This has highlighted some issues regarding parking availability, and we have been working closely with the Borough Council to alleviate the problems that residents from nearby properties have been experiencing due to the extra volume of cars. We are pleased to advise that following requests we have also managed to arrange for a portable toilet to be installed there during the period of the year when the facility is in use.







The summer season is here and the Scout Section is off camping again.

The destination this time is Solent Scout Training Centre (more familiarly known as Lyons Copse) in Shedfield in the wilds of Hampshire.

The campsite offers a wide range of activities from wall climbing and abseiling, to pond dipping and nature trails. Lyons Copse is 'strictly for Scouting' campsite and is not open to the general public. It has two campfire circles and several sites suited for larger or smaller camps..





Most Scouts enjoy the assault course best – with the option of a muddy landing if they literally lose their touch or simply run out of steam! Lot of other activities – archery, rifle shooting, abseiling, orienteering and a climbing tower.

well-stocked tuck shop enough to keep any Scout happy.





Although Christmas still seems a long time away, now is the time of year our thoughts turn again to the gift of Christmas shoe boxes. Over the last few years readers of Popley Matters have given very generous support to this Appeal and have donated hundreds of boxes to this caring, humanitarian cause. Last year over 20,000 boxes were collected by the Rotary movement in Hampshire alone and distributed by members of Rotary.

This Christmas Rotary will again be collecting and transporting Christmas shoe boxes for children who live in the mountains and very poor regions of Montenegro, Albania, Romania and in the cold foothills of Mt Kilimanjaro in Tanzania. You are invited to make up and donate shoe boxes, which will bring joy and delight to these children who have virtually nothing.

If you would like to make up a box here are some helpful suggestions:

Choose the sex and age range for the child you would like to receive your box.

The age ranges for boxes are: 1-3 years, 4-7 years, 8-11 years, 12-15 years.

Please ensure that all items included are new or 'as new'.

Last year there was a great shortage of boxes for children in the older age groups.

Suggested items you might include:

Learning toys, mosaics, Lego, games, balls, jigsaws, modeling clay, sticky tape, coloured paper, skipping ropes, playing cards, dominoes, chess sets and clothing such as socks, gloves, pants, tights, hats, scarves.

Depending on the age you select you may like to include items for use at school, e.g. ball point pens, pencils, pencil sharpeners, erasers, paper, colouring pencils, solar powered calculators, geometry sets.

Soap, combs, face cloths, hand cream, talc, football memorabilia of famous teams, sports magazines, books, especially paper-back English Classics.

Please do not include:

Food, drinks, liquids, items for the bath, sweets, large soft toys. swimwear, toilet rolls, large items of clothing, toy soldiers, toy guns and other military-type toys, penknives, anything breakable or anything which needs a battery.

While you are making up your box think of the delight on the face of 'your child' when they open **their** box that **you** have sent to them.


