### **New Open Space Facilities Coming to Popley!**

Residents have given their views on exciting plans to bring new play and open space facilities to Popley.

As part of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's local improvements programme funded by developers' contributions, a new multi-use games area is proposed for the Popley Community Park as well as the redesign of Tintern Close open space.

Through an online survey residents were asked what type of activities in the games area would best serve the community as well as what they would like to see considered at Tintern Close old tennis courts.

Plans include removing the old tennis/ball courts at Tintern Close and ideas such as space for dog walking, picnics, relaxation, exercise, play and local events are just some of the suggestions.

The two schemes respond to the community needs identified in the Popley East Community Plan and Marnel and Merton Community Group Action Plan.

The two initial consultations have now closed (Sunday 2 October 2016). However there will be a second round of consultation for the redesign of Tintern Close open space from late October 2016.

**Councillors' Page:** At last the new boundaries for the Hampshire County Council have been sent out. They have cut my division substantially and there will be quite a difference in the Oakridge part of my present division. however Popley will remain the same with from Don Allen Drive staying in Basingstoke West, and the Rooksdown part going into another division. Large parts of Norden will go into Basingstoke Central. The precise boundary can be viewed on the Electoral Commission website and also on Hampshire County Council's website. Next year the borough boundaries are being reviewed and I will expect more changes there too.

The consultation is now finished on how you the stakeholders and residents want the County Council to look like and represent you. The proposal to make a mega council does not make sense and I feel will erode any local feeling of belonging as decisions would be made miles away by people who may not know our area or make up at all. I think it will be very confusing in most of the new areas they (in London) have decided to carve us up into. At this point I nor anyone else knows what the people of Hampshire have said in the consultation that was conducted mostly online. Popley West: You should have received a leaflet with information on the proposal to build a massive new energy storage facility in Basing Woods/Carpenters Down. It would store electricity to use later. The surprise for me is that the application appears to have come from the Forestry Commission itself who manage the forest. The planning reference number is 16/02534/ FUL. It will be large to say the least. Yet more of our beautiful area gone and it is bound to affect the wildlife and lose more of our countryside. If you, like us, disagree then please look at the plan and take the opportunity to make your comments online, or on the leaflet. There must be more suitable sites than in the heart of our forest. We are losing far too much of our countryside.


The gas works continue to cause disruption and will go on for months yet. There is a phone number you can call if you have issues: 0800 912 1700.

The facility will store electricity and the application made to the Council appears to be on behalf of the Forestry Commission who manage the woods. We say this will have a detrimental impact on this community facility and create an industrial site in this natural wooded area. There is widespread opposition to the proposal and in our leaflet we have encouraged the community to write to the Planning Department of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council setting out objections to the proposal under reference 16/02534/FUL. We take this opportunity in Popley Matters to once again encourage as many people as possible to object to the proposal.

The Chineham Park Splash Pad will close at the end of September and overall has proven to be a great success. We believe our efforts to get this facility installed in this location has been worthwhile. We know there have been issues for some people and, where we can, we want to improve the splash pad facility for next season. You will have thoughts about the splash pad relating to parking, opening hours and other matters and we want to hear from you about these so that we can talk to the Council about improvements. I'm writing this as the end of a long and busy month approaches. September really seems to have whizzed by but has left some indelible memories. It was amazing to see how many children are now filling our schools and I'm sure the new school year has begun with many a shedding of tears! We commemorated the Battle of Britain on the 18<sup>th</sup> with special guests from RAF Odiham, The RAFA, 443 Sqn ATC and our Mayor and Deputy Mayor. In a few weeks the clocks will have gone back and it will be getting dark around 5pm in the afternoon.

I'm really not a great fan of the English winter, a series of seemingly endless grey, damp and cold days. I remember my days in the RAF stationed in Berlin where the temperature could drop to -20 degrees and everything was covered in snow. It was cold, but it was a crisp, sharp cold that you could wrap up against, rather than the cold, damp air of the English winter that seems to penetrate through to the marrow. Do I sound depressing? In a perverse kind of way I also enjoy the winter – the anticipation of things like Bonfire Night, Remembrance Sunday and the run up to Christmas and New Year.

December 21<sup>st</sup> is the shortest day of the year, after that it starts to get lighter again (Hooray!), even if only by one or two minutes a day. There is a natural rhythm to it all. Summer gives way to autumn, autumn to winter, winter to spring, and so on. The writer of the Book of Ecclesiastes in the Bible wrote about 'a time for everything, and a season for activity under the heaven; a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant, a time to uproot, a time to weep, a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance.' Again, because they don't have them in Belarus, the girls are great fans of our pubs! With Jane and Paul Frankum I took them to The Swan at Sherborne St John for a meal. Katya had a sea food dish while Julia and I had lamb shank. Julia had never eaten lamb before, due to the price in Belarus, as most of the meat consumed there is either chicken of pork.

One of the many places we visited was Highclere Castle as Downtown Abbey is a big hit in Belarus. After two exhausting weeks the girls left for the mountains in Poland.

After a short respite I collected Ira from Gatwick Airport on the 8th August.

Again, she insisted on helping me deliver Popley Matters, which was why they were later than normal that month!

In addition to being a great fan of our pubs, Ira particularly likes their names. The 'Slug and Lettuce' is her favourite to date!

Being a dedicated Anglophile, visiting a theatre in London is a must for Ira! She had tickets for The Mouse Trap, which Ira thoroughly enjoyed and I thought was OK. At least it was better than the visit to Chelsea's football ground which Ira had dragged me to on a previous visit!

As we'd been to Oxford during an earlier visit, I rashly offered to take Ira to Cambridge!

As she teaches English at the Belarusian State University, she's fascinated by our universities! After a tedious drive to Cambridge we took a bus tour of the universities which was of great interest to Ira.

I see much more of England when the girls are here!

Ira hopes to come again in January, for one week, as her visa lasts for six months and she intends to stock up on clothes which are much cheaper here during the sales!

Disputed Wills and Inheritance Act claims

The loss of a loved one is always a sad and difficult time. The situation can be made all the worse if there is a dispute over the contents of a will or if there is another inheritance issue. This is where our Litigation Team can help, working closely with our Wills & Probate Team, providing expert legal advice, with a sympathetic approach and with a minimum of distress.

An example of this is when we are sometimes asked if there is anything that can be done if a will fails to make adequate provision for someone who was financially dependent on the deceased.

Whilst we are generally free to dispose of our assets as we see fit, the law, through the *Inheritance (Provision for Family and Dependants) Act 1975*, does provide protection for people who have been financially dependant on the deceased. The aim of the Act is to provide legal protection for spouses, children and other dependants, where a person has died without leaving sufficient money for their continued wellbeing.

If a will fails to make reasonable financial provision, then you may be able to make an Inheritance Act claim. In this situation the court will take into account the applicant's needs and resources and consider these against what would be reasonable for their maintenance.

Alternatively, there may be various ways in which to challenge a will, for instance when a will has not been executed properly, where the testator did not have capacity to enter into a will or where undue pressure has been put on the testator from a third party.

If you are considering making a claim disputing the validity of a will or making a claim under the Inheritance Act, it is important that you seek specialist advice at the earliest opportunity. It is worth bearing in mind that to bring a claim under the Act, you must start your case in court within six months of the Grant of Probate being obtained. Permission of the court is required if a claim is made too late.
