Popley Matters Reaches 200th Issue.

In 1996, a group of local people met in Popley Fields Community Centre. We were sitting talking about the negative press, there had been a critical report in the Basingstoke Gazette and we were all saying how much we all loved living in Popley and loved our community. We wondered what we could do to change what we all felt was the wrong attitude to Popley. We also wanted let Popley residents know how much was available in Popley and what great people lived in our estate. Someone mentioned that there was a magazine called Popley Matters that used to be delivered and how good it would be if we could revive it. Paul Frankum said, "I will do an initial copy, but just the one to show how it could be done". Famous last words! Paul has guided us from an A4 one sheet fold over, to the booklet that was quarterly and then he carried on doing the monthly issues that we produce today.

We are here now at the 200th issue (196 that Paul has laid out). The magazine is self-funding, advertisements cover the cost so that we can pay the printer. There was also a Popley Forum for a number of years that had meetings around the estate on many subjects. We had from just a few and as many as 120 people, on many varied different issues. Your Councillors, agencies and residents worked together on many issues over the years and we had many successes. The main one was the regeneration of Popley but, sadly, because residents didn't attend or want to campaign, it ceased. The first four Popley Matters were in the early 1990s and were mainly advertising. We wanted to make it informative, interesting and to promote our clubs and local businesses. We hope we continue to keep you informed and give a chance to communicate with all our neighbours and read some interesting articles too. We try to promote what groups are available, where and when they meet. We are having a get together for anyone who has worked in anyway on or for Popley Matters in the long history of your community magazine. We know at least two who are coming who were involved in the original first copy. We have had messages from Rebecca Dobbie who won the competition to design the first cover, Jean, Hilary and David who were at the 1991/2 meeting in the old John Hunt School when the first Popley Matters was planned who are all going to try to be there at St Gabriel's on Church 6th October from 4 till 6pm for a real community "Bring a Plate and Share" get together.

We are also always looking for more volunteers and advertisers and people to write articles so we can continue into the future so contact me editor@popleymatters.org.uk.

You can read almost all of the old copies of Popley Matters and right up to date on www.popleymatters.org.uk. The copies of Popley Matters up to issue 117 are in the order that we have to send them to the printers so it appears that the pages are mixed up, but all the content is there and ready if you want to print off a copy for yourself.

An update on Rebecca Dobbie who designed the front cover for the first edition: "I did indeed design the cover of the first Popley Matters magazine. It was while I attended John Hunt of Everest school and the Art department ran a competition and it was open to all students. I still have a copy somewhere. I no longer live in Basingstoke and now am married with three children. After leaving school I went on to Queen Mary's College to do my A levels and then onto university. I had a wonderful career at Mars Drinks and then Regus before taking a career break to bring up my wonderful children - who are my world. Some of my family still live in Popley so we visit often".

Popley West: It has been a busy month again for Paul and me as the hedges seem to have grown much faster than I can remember before so we have been out checking where we can and asking they be cut. We have got over 20 street signs to be replaced but we don't have a timescale as yet because they have to be ordered and made. We have asked for bins and we were told we have to have the area monitored for three months to see if we qualify! You can guess we said this is unacceptable. The square bin in Popley Community Park is being held together by plastic ties and we have said we want a replacement bin that is fit for purpose. The notice boards were cleaned of graffiti but wrong chemicals used so they are now blank. At least the sign for Popley Community Park was done by a different team and is clean with writing still on it. We have also asked for a no dogs sign in the play area in Tintern Close. No dogs should go into play areas for the safety of the children and the dogs whether there is a sign or not. The long awaited barrier from DWH in Carter Drive has now been erected and in the place approved by the council.

It's been a glorious summer, very Enid Blyton' ish . Did the "Famous Five" ever suffer a bad summer? Wasn't it all trips to the seaside, sandwiches, followed by loads of pops? Sadly this modern summer is steadily drawing to a close and by the time you read this there will probably be a slight nip in the air of a morning and the curtains closed a little earlier each evening. On the bright side however this seasonal change heralds the beginning of a brand new season of short mat. What mat? --short mat! For any of you who don't fancy the continual traipse from end to end on the outside green, consider short mat as an alternative. You don't have to walk so far, you don't need muscles like a wrestler to launch the bowl from one end to the other and it's played indoors and out of the weather, in the warm, and - the bars open! How much closer can you get to utopia than that? If you know nothing about short mat bowls, it is virtually outdoor bowls but played indoors on a mat 45ft long by 6ft wide. 6th Basingstoke Boys' Brigade Newsletter



Our annual camping trip set off at 7am from St. Gabriel's Church with a group of blearyeyed youths ready for a week of fun and friendship.

We arrived at our site, set up and cracked on with the first activities, no real problems so it was a good start to the week. The second day was much different. Gale force winds and torrential rain battered Swanage. Lucky for us our tents and marquee are sturdy and take a beating, our new gazebo on the other hand, can't. Despite the bad weather we still got on with lots inside the marquee; games, team building and the back-up quiz.

The rest of the week the weather got better and better with every day. We managed to squeeze in all the activities we wanted to do even with Sunday's weather: a biking trip out to Old Harry's Rock; a session of kayaking involving a couple of the lad's "voluntarily" showing everyone else how to safely fall out of a kayak; we jumped on an open top bus to Bournemouth for the day; and had several trips to the beach plus a peek at the Bournemouth airshow. Most evenings were lit with a fire and everyone sat around playing games. Really great week for all.

Probus Hears About the Architects of Remembrance

November sees the centenary of the end of the Great War, the war to end all wars. In the last four years many have travelled to see the battlefields to gain a sense of what our forefathers endured during this appalling period in our history which cost the lives of so many.

As well as seeing evidence of the trench warfare, they have seen the War graves, those silent battalions who lie in such tranquillity.

Fewer people realise how these outstanding scenes came about and who were responsible for those temples of serenity we so admire today.

Rhydian Vaughan, who is Vice President of the Bramley Royal British Legion, has been Battlefield Guiding since 2000 with eclectic groups, large and small, old and young. Passion is his driving force and bringing history to life: his strap line is "Without a passionate Guide a battlefield is just a field."

The Probus Club of Basingstoke was enlightened to hear about how the War Graves and Memorials to the fallen of WW1 were designed and laid out by the three great architects of the time, Lutyens, Blomfield and Baker. Despite the fact that they all clashed with mighty egos, their legacy and architectural genius is responsible for the impressive array of headstones and memorials to be seen across this part of northern France and Flanders. The Imperial War Graves Commission was set up in 1917 and is today called the Commonwealth War Graves Commission whose headquarters are in Maidenhead. Regional offices are France, Belgium, Cyprus, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa. The fallen with no known grave are listed on the Memorials to the Missing including the Thiepval Memorial on the Somme and the Menin Gate, Ypres, where buglers play Last Post every day.

Bonfire Night Advice


With Bonfire Night so close here are some basic advice and tips.

- 1 Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves
- **2** Never give sparklers to a child under 5
- 3 Buy fireworks marked BS 7114
- 4 Keep fireworks in a closed box
- 5 Follow the instructions on each firework
- 6 Light them at arm's length using a taper
- 7 Stand well back
- 8 Never go back to a lit firework
- 9 Never put fireworks in your pocket
- 10 Never throw fireworks
- 11 Keep pets indoors

Setting fireworks off

One person should be in charge of the fireworks. If that's you, ensure you read the instructions in daylight and don't drink any alcohol until your fireworks set is over. On the night you will need...

- · a torch
- a bucket of water
- eye protection and gloves
- a bucket of soft earth to put the fireworks in
- suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or rockets

- Team Building Challenge the Cubs had to work together as a team to complete an obstacle course.


So as promised, here is a look at some of the activities the Cub section have got planned for the coming term.

Later Life Financial Crisis

Thousands of people who manage their retirement savings risk facing a financial crisis in the future.

That is according to a report from insurance group Zurich who warn that four in five retired people who are using a drawdown scheme to manage their pension fund have not set up a Lasting

Power of Attorney (LPA).

They would not be able to manage your pension, access your bank account to pay bills or allocate money for your care without applying to the Court of Protection, which can be a long and costly process.

The time to set up a LPA is well before you need it and all reputable pension providers and Independent Financial Advisors (IFAs) should be emphasising this to their clients.

By setting up a LPA you will be protecting yourself and the management of your finances if the worst should happen to you.
