### **Problems Getting Paid**

If you think your pay is wrong or you haven't been paid, the best thing you can do is talk to your employer to find out why.



If you and your employer can't agree on how much you should have been paid, you can <u>challenge</u> them.

You should act quickly - it'll be much harder to get your money back after 3 months from the date the problem arose.

#### Check your payslip

You should start by checking your payslip, if you've got one. This will help you see how your pay's been worked out. Check things like:

- · whether you've been paid for the number of hours you've actually worked
- if you've been paid at the correct rate
- if you've been paid for overtime, commission or bonus
- whether you've been paid any sick pay, holiday pay or maternity pay that you were expecting
- if your employer has deducted any money that you weren't expecting

If you're an employee or a worker, you have the legal right to a payslip which shows how your pay has been worked out. If you get paid per hour, your payslip has to show how many hours you've worked

If you don't have a payslip or your payslip doesn't show how your pay has been worked out, ask your employer to put this right. You can <u>check if you're an employee</u> or <u>check if you're a worker</u> on GOV.UK.

You can show your employer this guidance from Acas - it explains why they have to give you a payslip. If they won't agree, you'll need to raise a grievance with them.

#### Speak to your employer

Try speaking informally to your employer if you're having problems with your pay. You could also try speaking to your human resources or payroll department, if there is one.

Ask them to explain anything you don't understand on your payslip or why you haven't been paid. If you disagree with anything, explain why.

If your employer has made a genuine mistake, ask them to pay you the money you're owed straight away. You shouldn't have to wait until your next pay day.



County Councillor Report: I met five Mums by the traffic lights for the crossing from Tintern Close up to Don Allen Drive as the timings were completely out. It is impossible to cross the road as they only allowed 6 seconds to cross. The residents told me that cars were rolling forward and sometimes honking their horns. I was horrified as to how many people just took a chance and crossed. I saw parents with children not using the traffic light system. I know there is a subway and I saw no one use it at all. The underpass is steep and has often been flooded. The crossings were put there for the safe crossing for residents going to schools and to allow for all the development and when the shops are completed and open. I contacted Hampshire County Council with my grave concerns and they are going to monitor and adjust them. I impressed on them how urgent and serious I felt this issue was. Thank you Emma who came all the way from Ringwood and met us at 8.15am 21st and agreed. The timings have now been doubled before the red man comes on and, because of the sensors, traffic will not be held up any longer.

I was also contacted about the "20 is Plenty" notices along Popley Way near schools. These signs were put up a few years ago as a safety measure in conjunction with the schools. Some have slipped down or been vandalised so I have contacted the Schools Safety Team and asked that they be put back to the proper height. Popley West: Great news-the section 106 money of 406K has been officially released to be spent on play facilities and improvement to the area in Popley Community Park. At our meeting with the officers of the council we said that we wanted residents to have the choices and options to help design and improve the facilities, to make this a real family friendly park that can be enjoyed by everyone no matter what ability or age they are. We think that one of the big issues is the broken, rusty and torn fencing around the whole site. The entrance is ugly and boring so ideas there please? 45 years ago my late husband Ken and I said what a waste of the area it was as it was being used as a dumping ground. We didn't know how we would do it but every chance we had over the years when any grants were available we pushed to improve the facilities, With the help of residents, friends and family, we campaigned and got it slowly into the park it is today. Now Paul and I are delighted to be able to ask you to join us to develop it into an even better facility for us all to enjoy, a place where friends and families can meet and enjoy the outdoors.

As part of the works a bus shelter was installed at the stop close to Keats Close. However, although some improvements were made to the stop near to Marlowe Close, HCC's plans didn't include a shelter there. We listened to local residents and managed to negotiate the provision of a shelter which has now been put in place.

So many residents have contacted us regarding the problems with the waste collection service. These have included the failure to collect the waste from communal bin stores (in some cases for weeks on end), missed assisted collections and many other missed collections of both general waste, recycling and garden waste following the change of collection date. Concerns have also been raised about the use of resident's bins as 'slave' bins where one resident's bin is used to collect the waste from others. David chaired the Scrutiny Committee where these problems were discussed and Janet led the representations on behalf of Popley East residents. In the face of all the criticism the Council Leader admitted how the service had failed residents and assured us that the use of 'slave bins' will cease. Let us know if you continue to have problems.

Pue to a recent spate of theft from vehicle offences in the area, we would like to offer

would also like to offer some advice that is particularly important at this time of year.

Remember – most of these offences are opportunity.

simple precautions you can greatly reduce your likelihood of becoming a victim.

#### Theft from vehicle:

- Most offences of theft from vehicle are opportunist. When leaving your car, close all windows and lock your car. This is the best way to protect your belongings.
  - Upon locking your vehicle try your car door to ensure it is actually locked!
  - Take all your personal possessions with you and do not leave items on display.
- · Even items of little value, such as shopping bags and clothing, may tempt a potential thief to break into the vehicle to see whether they contain anything worth stealing. They may even be tempted by such things as coins for the car park, sunglasses, packs of medication or other items that can earn quick cash.
  - Fit an alarm or immobiliser to your car.
- Register your possessions for free at www.immobilise.com in doing so you will assist the police in returning your property should it be lost or stolen.
- Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws. The easiest way to change the identity of a stolen vehicle or avoid speeding tickets and parking tickets is to fit stolen number plates. Using security screws to attach your vehicle's number plates makes it harder for thieves to get your number.
- Fit locking, anti-tamper wheel nuts to secure alloy wheels. Stolen wheels are valuable, either as parts or for their scrap value. Using locking wheel nuts reduces the risk of your vehicle's wheels being stolen.
- Secure anything that's on the outside of your vehicle. Anything left on roof-racks, tailgate racks, holiday top boxes or in tool chests are easily stolen when the vehicle is parked. The use of cable locks, padlocks and self-locking tools chests, which are secured to the vehicle, makes them more secure, but still, don't leave things in them if you can avoid it.
- Report all suspicious activity or offences to the police. Even if we cannot take immediate action it well help us build a better picture of the issue which will help us combat it more effectively in the long-run.

#### Advice for the Festive Period:

- · Do not advertise your absence.
- · When you go out at night make it appear that someone is home. Draw the curtains, and leave a light on. You could always put a lamp or radio on a timer switch.
  - Use timer switches, available from DIY stores, to switch on lights and other appliances.
  - Don't leave Christmas presents in view of a window.
- If you are buying or receiving valuable gifts such as bikes, mobiles or electrical items register them for free at www.immobilise.com in doing so you will assist the police in returning your property should it be lost or stolen.
- · Dispose of present packaging carefully as empty boxes left outside can advertise that you have goods inside.
  - · Refrain from keeping large amounts of cash at home.
- · A secure home will reduce the chance of a burglary. Make sure windows and doors are locked every time you leave the house.
  - Avoid leaving tools and ladders lying around that could assist someone get into your home.
- Never allow people into your home unless you are expecting them or have made arrangements with the company beforehand.
  - Never buy goods and services at the door or give away personal information.
  - If you are going away don't advertise this fact on social networking sites such as Facebook.

Unfortunately the council could not supply all the information we had hoped for in time for Popley Matters, and what they sent was a short message: "Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council has exciting plans to provide improvements to play and recreational facilities within Popley Community Park. Funded through developer contributions, the project will provide additional play and open space facilities for the park. The council would like to hear from residents about what they would like to see and will be asking for views soon. Look out for posters in the park, local shops and community venues or follow the council @BasingstokeGov on Facebook or Twitter. We will be in touch again soon with updates on the consultation and when it will go live etc."

Over forty five years ago when my sons were very young we could not afford to go on holidays and there was little then locally to go to that was free. The huge field that is now Popley Community Park was a dumping ground for fly tipping and the council brought all the hedges and tree branches to burn. Smoke billowed across the roads. Ken and I dreamed of a wonderful park and said what a waste it was then, what a wonderful space to have a family park. We didn't know how we could achieve it but fate stepped in and I became a Councillor and my son Paul followed a year later. The site was cleared, a few years later a BMX track was built there, but it never really got used that much. Fate knocked at the door again and Popley got lots of regeneration so that meant developer money. We negotiated with the Council officers that money should be spent on really good leisure facilities and a family park that everyone could enjoy and should be able to be enjoyed by all residents. As money became available the park started to grow, all the time waiting till the biggest chunk of money would be released. Well now it has 406K and you, the residents, will be consulted. Over many years we have spoken to people about what they would like and a rough outline was drawn up that will include replacing the ugly rusty and broken fencing, the concrete mound flattened to make more playable space, more equipment for play, outdoor gym equipment, disabled friendly equipment, a running/walking track and a wildlife area for schools to bring the children to learn about our ecology. You will decide; we might be lucky enough to get it all. When my dear Ken was dying his final words were "look after Popley and our park" and of course "I love you", and we can now keep that promise It has been an uphill climb for Paul and Me but Kenny, it is going to happen. Hope he smiles down from heaven.

#### Dear Friends.

There's an old joke that goes something like this: Three ministers are discussing how they got rid of mice in their churches. The Pentecostal minister says "We prayed against their presence, and then they all left." The Baptist minister says "We preached against their presence, and then they all left". And the Church of England minister says "We baptised them all, and we haven't seen them in church since." If I'm honest it feels a bit like that at times in St Gabriel's!

It is one of the greatest privileges of my ministry to conduct Christenings and they are always cause for great celebration. It is always so lovely to meet parents, Godparents, family and friends and afterwards there is usually a party somewhere with most probably, jelly and ice cream, where everyone can have a great time.

Many of the parents say that they always mean to keep the promises they've made and bring their children to church but once they stop coming as part of the preparation it becomes harder and harder to start again – mostly through a sense of embarrassment at not coming and what people might say or think about them.

This isn't uncommon! How many times do we make promises to family, friends, and neighbours, or people we meet on holiday and get on well with? We promise to keep in touch with them "I'll give you a call" we say, and we always mean to, but the daily pressures of life seem to pile in and time goes by so quick that before you know it months have slipped by and we feel so embarrassed about not keeping in touch that we're afraid to pick up the phone or stick our heads around the door for fear of rejection. I know because I've been there, done that and got the T-shirt!

It's been my experience that this is most usually an irrational fear! People are always glad to hear from old friends or family that they haven't seen or spoken to for a while – some folk are just glad to hear from someone - anyone!

If you haven't been to church for a while and you've been meaning to come but just feel too shy or that it might be too embarrassing then may I invite you, personally, to come along one Sunday morning to St Gabriel's - no questions asked, no judgements passed, believe me when I say, it would be a pleasure to see you and to remake old acquaintance,

Jesus told the parable of the shepherd who lost one of his hundred sheep and left the other ninety-nine to go in search of that one that was lost. He is still searching today for those that have wandered away, longing to find them and to bring them home to great rejoicing. In these uncertain times we could all do with the holding on to someone as changeless as the Son of God who promises a welcome to any who would come to Him.

I continue to look forward to seeing many of you soon and catching up on all your news. With every blessing in Christ.
