Report to Trading Standards

If you think a company has broken the law or acted unfairly, you might be able to report them to Trading Standards.

What should you report to Trading Standards

Basingstoke

You should report a company to Trading Standards if, for example:

- they misled you into buying their products or services
- they sold you unsafe or dangerous items
- they didn't carry out the work properly, for example, their work left your home in a dangerous state
- they sold you fake or counterfeit items
- they pressured you to buy something you didn't want to buy
- they sold you a car that wasn't 'roadworthy' (it would cause danger if it was on the road)

How to report a trader to Trading Standards

Call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline and tell them you want to report a trader to Trading Standards. The consumer helpline will assess your problem and pass it on to Trading Standards if it's appropriate.

We don't charge for calls to the consumer helpline. Your service provider could charge you for your call, but it should be free if either:

- · your contract includes all calls to landlines
- you're within your free minutes allowance for calls to landlines

You might be charged if your contract doesn't include all calls to landlines or you've used all your free minutes. For example, a 10 minute call could cost:

- £4.40 if you're an EE pay as you go customer find out more about EE call charges







With the festive period in full swing there are, I hope, plenty of opportunities for celebration. Unfortunately this time of year also presents opportunities for criminal activity. As a result I would like to leave residents with some basic crime prevention advice. Basingstoke police wish you a safe and happy Christmas.

When Shopping:

-Make sure your handbag is closed so a pickpocket would find it difficult to get into without you knowing.

-Never leave a bag unattended in a trolley, even if for a couple of seconds.

- -Try to keep wallets in an inside pocket and out of sight from a potential pickpocket.
- -When entering your PIN number at a terminal ensure no one can see you enter it.
- -Try to pay for items on a debit card rather than carrying large amounts of cash. If

this is not possible keep cash to a minimum.

- -Before you leave your car, ensure all windows and doors are closed and locked.
- -Avoid leaving your purchases and presents in your vehicle. If you must make sure they are not on display, store in the boot, and make sure the car is locked.
- -Think about the item you are buying someone are there any security products you could purchase to help them keep it safe? I.e. if buying a bike think about also giving an accredited D lock.

At Cashpoints:

- -If you see someone suspicious hanging around, cancel the transaction and use another cashpoint.
- -Before inserting your card have a look at the machine to check it looks normal.
- -When entering your PIN number, make sure others around cannot see.
- -Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Only withdraw what you reasonably need.
- -Put your money and your cards away safely before leaving the machine.

At Home:

- -Don't leave Christmas presents in view of a window.
- -If you are buying or receiving valuable gifts such as bikes, mobiles or electrical items, register them for free at www.immobilise.com. In doing so you will assist the police in returning your property should it be lost or stolen.
- -Dispose of present packaging carefully as empty boxes left outside can advertise that you have goods inside.
- -Refrain from keeping large amounts of cash at home.
- -A secure home will reduce the chance of a burglary. Make sure windows and doors are locked every time you leave the house.
- -Avoid leaving tools and ladders lying around that could assist someone get into your home.
- -When you go out at night make it appears that someone is home. Draw the curtains, and leave a light on. You could always put a lamp or radio on a timer switch.
- -Never allow people into your home unless you are expecting them or have made arrangements with the company beforehand.
- -Never buy goods and services at the door or give away personal information.

If you are going away:

Signs of occupation help deter intruders.

- -Check you have locked all doors, windows and skylights. If you have an alarm, ensure it is activated.
- -Inform trusted neighbours and ask if they will keep an eye on your property for you and collect your post.
- -Use timer switches on lamps and radios so it looks as though you are home.
- -Remember to cancel any deliveries such as milk and newspapers.

If you are out for the evening:

- -Drink sensibly and stay with your friends.
- -Plan in advance how you will get home.
- -Save the number of a licensed taxi firm in your mobile phone. Always check the driver's identification and never get into an unlicensed taxi. Text the licence plate number to a friend.
- -Don't accept drinks from strangers or leave your drink unattended.
- -Whether you are male or female, avoid walking alone, and never take short cuts through dark alleys or large open spaces.
- -Keep your belongings with you, and your valuables out of sight.
- -Never leave your bag hanging over a chair or personal items left unattended.
- -Don't drink or drug drive, remember you may still be over the limit the morning after a big night out.

To do this, proposals include a £5 average increase for the borough's part of the Council Tax and a 3% average increase in fees and charges to help pay for the cost of optional services the council offers.

Over the last 11 years £13.7 million in savings have been made without cutting services, with the borough council continuing to look at how it can run more efficiently.

Further savings of £1.42 million have been identified in 2020/21, increasing to £1.82 million by 2023/24.

Executive Director of Finance and Resources said: "Residents give the area a 94% satisfaction rating however the council is not complacent. Based on what people and businesses have said matters to them, this draft plan sets priorities that put residents at the heart of the council's future plans.

"This is supported by the council's proposals to deliver a balanced budget for 2020 to 2021.

"As residents, businesses and partner organisations are key to the success of these plans, the council would like to hear from a range of people to help shape its proposals."
