



County Councillor Report: Happy New year to you all.

The proposed parking /yellow lines has moved a stage nearer and is in the Democratic Services department ready to go to the portfolio holder and then cabinet for approval. It should be starting in February if approved. At County Council Popley East Councillors and I are seeing what can be done to stop some drivers doing illegal U turns into Shakespeare Road. This is dangerous and in fact takes longer than if they simply followed the rules and used the roundabout. There have been some interesting proposals to consider.

I have asked for a meeting with officers in regard to some paths needed from Tintern Close to the bus stop and a small path with dropped kerb from Abbey Road to the Apollo, also a path from Abbey Court and St Bede's up to the shops. I will report back when I have more news.

There have been some long awaited repairs to some of the paths in Abbey Road and others where tree roots have severely damaged the footways. I have now been informed the manhole covers in the Abbey Road shopping area are the responsibility of SSE.

Popley West: By now you will hopefully have seen that the Post Office and newsagents is opening on 7th January Thank you to the 1,500 people who signed the petition.

The closing date has now passed for the consultation on Popley Community Park and we thank everyone who sent in their suggestions. There were some really wonderful ideas and the officers, Paul and I will go through them. It is expected that the works and improvements to the park will start in the spring.

Despite claims that the bin collections are much better residents tell us differently Though most bins are collected the day after if they have been missed we still have residents contacting us to say their bins are being missed and then told they will have to wait till the following collection date.

We are working on getting improvements to the dropped kerbs as some are so steep they are difficult to manage in a disability buggy. If you are disabled and have any issues about access or parking please contact us details below.

As ward councillors we had long argued for the conversion of the empty property to provide both affordable homes for rent available to local people, but also to include a room for use by the wider community.

The property now comprises of 10 apartments, and has 11 allocated parking spaces. Once the community room is equipped and available for bookings we will provide an update through our regular newsletters as to how this can be arranged.

We are aware that some drivers are still undertaking the dangerous U-turn manoeuvres in Popley Way despite the measures that have been put in place by HCC following our representations. These drivers are now using the entrance to Shakespeare Road to turn around despite the installation of the new island and this is resulting in them driving over the grass verges immediately adjacent to the tactile paving area of the new footpath. It's dangerous. We have arranged to meet with Officers from Hampshire County Council Highways to discuss a solution and will let you know the outcome once agreed.



The Dragonfly Project Seeks To Raise Domestic Violence and Abuse Awareness Across Hampshire.

Domestic Violence and Abuse is an issue which affects all communities. One in four women and one in six men are affected by domestic abuse at some point in their lifetime. Currently, the UK government 'Domestic Violence Bill 2017-2019' is being reviewed by the Public Bill Committee, and if successful, will bring about significant change in support for those affected and prosecution of offenders nationwide. This bill will introduce the first statutory definition of domestic violence and abuse, including economic abuse, and controlling and coercive non-physical abuse.

The YOU Trust started The Dragonfly Project in 2016 in Dorset, with the aim of raising awareness of Domestic Violence and Abuse (DVA) and the services available with a specific focus on targeting isolated people and communities. Since the start of the project in Dorset, the team has successfully trained over 900 members of the community to become champions for the Dragonfly Project, increasing referrals for support by 25%.

This year, the project is expanding to Hampshire, covering Basingstoke, Winchester, Andover, Eastleigh, New Forest, and the Isle of Wight. Across Hampshire you will start to see the Dragonfly Project emblem appearing in shop windows, pubs, community support services, salons, and more, providing you with the key contact details of who to call if you are in need of support. Additionally, if you see the Dragonfly sticker or badge, this indicates that the person wearing this is a Champion for the Dragonfly Project, and has received the necessary training to provide you with advice and guidance to access specialist DVA support.

If you are interested in getting involved and can attend training to become a Champion for the Dragonfly Project, please contact the team. Training is run in group sessions of 6-20 people and can be organised at the group's preferred location.

DRIVERS REQUIRED

We provide a service for elderly people in YOUR NeighbourCare community. Particularly for those who find it difficult to use public transport or lack the confidence to go out on their own. We provide a driving service to pick them up from home, take them to their appointment and bring them home again, using our volunteers' own car. We also take clients shopping, to social events such as lunch clubs, helping them remain part of their community.

We need drivers who can spare a few hours a week during the day time, Monday to Friday, and who have a car that is comprehensively insured and suitable for carrying an elderly person. In return we will cover your petrol cost from home; currently we pay 45p per mile. Some of our drivers currently work shifts and can only offer 1 or part of a day per week but even this amount of time can help us. You can choose what hours/days you are available and what duties you undertake.

BEFRIENDERS REQUIRED

Would you have an hour a week free? Many elderly people would love to have someone to come and see them for a cup of tea and a chat. You could be the first person they see that week who has time just for them! You will gain great satisfaction and help them to relieve their loneliness. We try to find you someone who lives near to you so that if you do not have your own transport you can walk to them. But if you have to use your car or public transport we will reimburse your costs. We particularly need people who are available during the daytime on weekdays.

We need people who have time and patience and like talking to elderly people. You need to have good listening skills and be able to show empathy. We will provide you with training and support and match you with one of our clients. Our befriending co-ordinator will take you to your first meeting with our client and support you as necessary.

Bank of Mum and Dad

Are you thinking of helping your child get onto the property ladder? If you are, you are not alone.

According to a recent survey by Just Group, over the last five years, parents and grandparents have helped three in every five first-time buyers purchase their property.


Parents should not think that they can simply agree with their child that the money is a gift. This is because your child will be asked for proof of funds by their lawyer.

They will require a letter from you confirming that the money you are providing is a gifted deposit and that you will have no rights over the property. Normally a signed letter to your child should be sufficient, with a copy being passed to their lawyer.

Their lawyer will also need to receive photo identification from you, such as a passport or driving licence. They also need a document showing proof of your address, like a bank statement and utility bill.

Furthermore, they will also need to know where the funds came from. For example, was it from a pension draw, the sale of shares or the sale of a house?

If it is money coming from savings, you will have to provide bank statements showing how the money has been accruing over the last two to six months.

Fraud is now the most commonly reported crime, and anyone can become a victim, regardless of age, sex or income. Every year the British public loses billions of pounds to fraudsters who bombard us with online, mail, door-to-door and telephone scams. Fraud occurs when someone lies or deceives you in order to cause harm, most commonly by taking money, and there are many types of fraud. With this in mind Basingstoke Police would like residents to bear in mind the following advice:

-Be suspicious! If it seems 'too good to be true', it usually is. There are no guaranteed get rich-quick schemes.

-Take time to consider offers or deals, do not be pressured into accepting things before you have time to think. Insist on time to obtain independent/ legal advice before making a decision.

-Do not hand over money or sign anything until you have checked the credentials of the company or individual.

-Never send money to anyone you do not know or trust, whether in the UK or abroad, or use methods of payment that you are not comfortable with.

-Never give banking or personal details to anyone you do not know or trust. This information is valuable so make sure you protect it.

-Always log on to a website directly rather than clicking on links provided by an email.

-Do not rely solely on glowing testimonials: find solid independent evidence of a company's success.

-Always get independent/ legal advice if an offer involves money, time or commitment.

-Your bank or the police will never ask you for your 4-digit PIN or online banking password, ask you to withdraw money for them, ask you to transfer money to a new account, send someone to your home to collect cash or banking details, or ask you to purchase goods for them.

-Do not be embarrassed to report a scam. Because the scammers are cunning there is no shame in being deceived. By reporting you will make it more difficult for them to deceive others.

-In Hampshire all fraud should be reported to Action Fraud, via www.actionfraud.police.uk, or by phoning on 0300 123 2040. In addition, you may wish to report to the police direct by calling 101.

-You can find more information on the types of fraud and scams commonly used and how you may better protect yourself from them on the Action Fraud website and the Hampshire Constabulary website under the 'Advice and Information' section.
