### Council Considering Options for Programme of Summer Entertainment

and Deane With the ongoing uncertainty during the COVID-19 pandemic, Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council is exploring options to safely deliver a programme of outdoor arts, music and performances this summer.

Basingstoke Festival is set to make a return to the borough this summer with 17 days of performances, music, dance and arts between Friday 25 June and Sunday 11 July 2021.

Due to the uncertainty of social distancing restrictions which may still be in place and to keep Basingstoke and Deane safe, the borough council is working with artists and local art organisations to explore how it can hold virtual and socially distanced events.

However, it is unlikely that crowds will be able to return for B LOVE Festival, which brings over 100 live music acts, family entertainment and art in unusual places to be War Memorial Park and is the finale event of Basingstoke Festival.

While work continues to investigate how the festival can be safely delivered in line with government restrictions which may be in place in the summer, there is still plenty to look forward to.

From February, the council's Art in Unusual Times virtual programme, in partnership with local artists and organisations, will bring residents the best in arts and crafts, dance, theatre performances and public art.

Activities include arts and craft sessions using recycled materials with Basingstoke-based entertainer Junk Jodie, interactive Basing-folk storytelling sessions with local theatre company Pumpkin Pantos and the return of the successful Window Wanderland project which will return to communities across the borough, filling their windows with bright and colourful art.

Cabinet Member for Communities, Culture and Partnerships Cllr Simon Bound said: "We know the COVID-19 pandemic has been a difficult time for residents across the borough and we are keen to provide a fun-filled programme of entertainment this summer that everyone can look forward to.

"But ultimately, the safety of our residents must come first and we are continuing to monitor the latest government guidance and are working with art organisations and members of the arts and culture industry to understand how we may be able to safely deliver the annual Basingstoke Festival.

"We are very lucky to have talented artists, performers and arts organisations in our borough. I am pleased that we are able to bring residents an exciting selection of virtual arts and culture through our Art in Unusual Times programme which we hope will bring some much-needed entertainment to enjoy in the comfort of their own homes." County Councillor Report: The County Waste tip is running a bit better and there are more slots available but we still have lazy inconsiderate people who seem to think they don't have to follow the rules, and are still dumping furniture, white goods and all manner of things. Do you have items you don't want? Do you need items you don't have! 100% free... NO SELLING! This group is for the 'whisking' of items to others FREE OF CHARGE.

I was chatting to a friend on Messenger who asked me if I was in the 'I need a whisk' group. I had never heard of it so asked her about it. She explained it was a group where people would exchange goods for free, no money exchanged! I thought it was a great idea and went to search. Then realising Basingstoke didn't have one, I waited a week checking each day to see if one had been made. I spoke to friend and colleague Ginny Bailey about it and asked her if I set a page up would she help with me with being in admin/moderator role. She agreed and after a few more days I opened the group. My driving force was that I wanted Basingstoke and the surrounding areas to help each other out and be a better community. The Covid pandemic has brought out the best in so many people. Clothing and household products were the actual feature. The page was set up within a day. My sister-in-law sorted her food cupboard out and posted it on the page, which prompted Naomi who vounteers at one of the four hubs that distribute the food, to contact me with regards to us working with the food banks, They arrange food parcels for those in need! Almost immediately I received a private message asking if the group could help their family. Then another followed very quickly. These current times have become very tough for so many and it is difficult for some people to ask or know where help is available. I also recognised that some really don't want their personal business on the group itself but were in desperate need. I myself had found myself relying on the food bank when my son was little. The admins put themselves forward to help wherever they could. We now have Louise who helps those in need of clothes and don't want their names on a public site. Very understandable and something we support and agree with. It remains completely confidential and they can pm her, or anyone else on the admin in confidence. Our present helpers include Naomi helps with the food. Selina is our volunteer if anyone wants to privately arrange children's toys. Please note, you do not need to be struggling to ask for items you may want. The page is there for anyone to use and help each other. It also helps with recycling all types of items; Instead of throwing those away or just taking up room in your cupboards, someone else will make good use of them. Join our group and post them on the page. I was taken aback and still quite shocked as to how well this group has taken off. Jane, the Editor of this Popley Matters, joined at about number 23 and did a share then those people shared and in less than a week we have (at present) 1200 and we are absolutely delighted. But more importantly within the first two days we were able to help five families. February 2021

#### MAKING THE BEST OF IT

Our Rotary President usually takes on their role of leading the club in June each year, but in these altered times it was decided last June, when we all thought life would be different by Christmas, to roll this forward to January. So now after being our President for 18 months Alf McCarthy has handed over the role to our new President Gareth Lewis. The club wishes him well for his Presidency.

And so we review our year.

All our social activities have been cancelled. Our formal events such as Charter Night, Presidents Night and Charity evening didn't happen. Most of our fundraising has come to an abrupt end but prudently we did have some funds tucked away that we could put to good use.

So did we achieve anything worth mentioning?

We helped Mencap sell some of their produce - which raised much needed money for them. More importantly we helped Mencap fund the replacement of their dying van without which they would not be able to function.

We also helped Besom replace their Besom in Basingstoke helps people make a difference. It provides a bridge between those who want to give time, money, things or skills and those who are in need. It ensures what is given is used effectively. The service it provides is free. For example someone may be refurbishing a room and have good quality furniture to donate to Besom who then give it someone who has been homeless and is moving to an empty new home. Effective recycling!

We purchased equipment for Helping Hands for the Blind allowing them to continue running the community radio station from volunteers' homes. An essential lifeline in normal times but this year many more people have learned about, and benefitted from, the work of this great local

We supported the Spotlight food bank both financially and with drivers in the longer term to help deliver food parcels. Rotarians also helped Inspero deliver their food parcels.

We have again supported Age Concern with their social therapy groups.

We continue to support Lend with Care, a microfinance charity which enables people in the UK to make small loans to entrepreneurs from poor communities around the world. This charity changes lives by lifting people out of poverty by financing loans for them to start their own businesses.

Against all the odds we managed to set up a pop-up restaurant to provide Christmas lunch for the clients and volunteers of the Camrose Centre who do wonderful work caring for the homeless in the borough.

As Rotarians, the icing on the cake at the end of 2020 was that, at very short notice, we, along with the other Rotary Clubs in North Hampshire were asked to help the local GP practices with setting up the site and marshalling patients for the vaccination programme. It's our hope for the future.

Rotary Foundation is one of the largest charities in the world. During the year we received three grants totalling £5,000 from Foundation towards our projects, including -

We are raising funds to finance the provision of equipment for Basingstoke Hospital to treat a debilitating heart condition called Atrial Fibrillation, which whilst a little known condition, affects large numbers of the population. The equipment will cost approx, £60,000 in total, towards which we have to date raised £18,000. Our Rotary target is £30,000 with the balance being funded by a matched grant.

### **Update on Austen Academy and its Progress**

The Austen Academy has been commissioned by Hampshire County Council to provide much needed additional places for children with special educational needs. All new schools are required by the Department for Education to be academies and therefore Children's Services has worked with the DfE to secure the capital investment and Hampshire County Council has led the delivery of the building project. Over the past five years the number of children with Education Health and Care Plans has doubled. Around 40% of children with such special needs have their needs met within a specialist school and the Austen Academy is therefore needed to assist in meeting the increased demand. Alongside the Austen Academy, the County Council has increased places at existing special schools and developed new resourced provisions in mainstream schools. More places are planned including the creation of another 90 place setting on the Samuel Cody Special School site, which is currently subject to consultation. Special schools do not have catchment areas but we try wherever possible to locate children in their nearest available provision to ensure children are educated within local communities.

The first sixteen pupils have been identified and will start this spring.

The school will be opening with 16 pupils in April 2021. This increases to: 40 in September 2021, 64 in September 2022, 88 in September 2023, 112 in September 2024; with a maximum number of 128 in September 2025.

#### Dear Friends

I sat yesterday afternoon and watched the inauguration of Joe Biden as the 46<sup>th</sup> President of the USA. I found parts of the ceremony quite moving and the speeches particularly pertinent to this great nation in all of its internal struggles and divisions at the personal and corporate level.

I was especially touched by some of the things the new president mentioned in his inaugural speech and by the young inaugural poet Amanda Gorman. The President spoke of an end to 'this uncivil war' and appealed for unity to "heal the country's deep wounds of toxic political tribalism, the pain of the pandemic and racial strife... History, faith and reason show the way, the way if unity" he said. "We can see each other not as adversaries but as neighbours. We can treat each other with dignity and respect. We can join forces, stop the shouting and lower the temperature. For without unity there is no peace, only bitterness and fury." Powerful and prophetic words. Amanda Gorman echoed the same sentiments in the specially written poem that she recited. She began with an image of despair "When day comes we ask ourselves where can we find light in this never-ending shade?" She then quickly moved in some really uplifting words "And yet the dawn is ours before we knew it..."

In this Epiphany season the Church celebrates the annual 'Week of Christian Unity' when churches across our town and our nation will be considering ways in which we can work more closely together to bring about the dawning of the light of Christ. The prophet Isaiah wrote: 'Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn." This, centuries before the revelation of Jesus Christ as a babe in a manger.

Epiphany means 'revelation' and Jesus is revealed as the one who comes to reunite us with God and to bring about the restoration of all of creation into the perfect unity which he originally intended. Unity is a calling to work together and He longs that we should strive to achieve that goal. That is why I found the words of Joe Biden and Amanda Gorman so inspiring yesterday.

May we respectively take on board that call to unity so "We can see each other not as adversaries but as neighbours. We can treat each other with dignity and respect..." and in this week of Christian Unity to heed the call of Jesus recorded in John's Gospel chapter 17: "My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one."

May He richly bless you, your family and your neighbours in the week ahead.





#### Pupils Set to Turn Back Time for Local History Competition

The Mayor of Basingstoke and Deane has re-launched an English Civil War art and poetry competition for young people in the borough after it was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mayor Cllr Diane Taylor is inviting all schools and sixth form students in the borough to produce a piece of artwork or a poem relating to the Battle of Basing House in 1645.

Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council, Hampshire Cultural Trust and Hampshire County Council are co-running the educational project which commemorates the 375th anniversary of the battle in 2020.

Pupils will learn how the nationally important historic site at Old Basing was besieged and destroyed by Oliver Cromwell. Basing House was the last Royalist stronghold in the south east and a key site in the battle between King and Parliament at the end of the English Civil War.

Art entries for the competition can be in any form, for example drawing, photography, sculptures and music, together with poems, and should be inspired by Basing House and/or the English Civil War. The closing date is Friday 12 March 2021 and judging will take place on Friday 19 March 2021.

There are three categories – primary, secondary and sixth form. Subject to coronavirus restrictions being lifted, all the winners will be invited to join the Mayor at a special opening of the English Civil War Art and Poetry Exhibition at Basing House, where they will receive a Mayor's plaque and an annual family pass to Basing House.

The winners' schools will also each receive a free educational visit to Basing House, potentially including a travel bursary.

Cllr Taylor said: "The borough has a rich and fascinating history and 2020 marked an important milestone with the 375th anniversary of the Battle of Basing House. We weren't able to go ahead with the planned events in the summer due to the pandemic, but we are now pleased to re-launch the English Civil War art and poetry competition.

"The project is a perfect opportunity for young people to learn more about the English Civil War and I hope as many pupils as possible will contribute to the art and poetry competition – it is a chance to stretch their creative talents."

### **Update from Chineham Medical Practice January 2021**

As many of you will know, the local Covid-19 vaccination centre is based at the Hampshire Court Hotel, RG24 8FY and is in collaboration with all practices in North Hampshire. This arrangement was decided as the Government required the service to run at Primary Care Network population scale and it minimises disruption of normal general practice services.

The capacity at the Hampshire Court Hotel is increasing to match increased availability of vaccination supplies and we are ready to increase the number of people vaccinated as soon as we have it. We are following the priority guidelines established by the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Their priority list is as follows:

- 1. Residents in a care home for older adults and their carers
- 2. All those 80 years of age and over and frontline health and social care workers
- 3. All those 75 years of age and over
- 4. All those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals
- 5. All those 65 years of age and over
- 6. All individuals aged 16 years to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk of serious disease and mortality
- 7. All those 60 years of age and over
- 8. All those 55 years of age and over
- 9. All those 50 years of age and over

We appreciate the concern and frustration people feel when they know there is a vaccine and they can't get access to it. Please be reassured that as soon as we have stock we will be contacting eligible patients directly in order of priority to organise these appointments. Although we are unable to be specific about when individual groups will be receiving their vaccination as this is entirely dependent on national availability of stock which is not control locally, people will receive the vaccination.

In the meantime you do not need to contact the practice to request a vaccine. Please keep safe and follow the government guidelines.
