

I am writing to let you know that Chineham Library will be temporarily closed to browsing Monday 26 April 2021 – Friday 14 May 2021 inclusive, reopening on 15 May 2021.

This temporary closure is to facilitate a refurbishment programme which will enable the relocation of the School Library Service from South Ham Library into Chineham. Improvement works will include creating a new workspace for School Library Service, and relocation of Chineham's children's library to accommodate this move.

During the closure period, collection of Ready Reads and Reservations will continue.

During the closure, neighbouring libraries in Basingstoke and Tadley will remain open and able to provide service to our Chineham customers.

### DRIVERS REQUIRED

We provide a service for elderly people in YOUR community. Particularly for those who find it difficult to use public transport or lack the confidence to go out on their own. We provide a driving service to pick them up from home, take them to their appointment and bring them home again, using our volunteers' own car. We also take clients shopping, to social events such as lunch clubs, helping them remain part of their community.

We need drivers who can spare a few hours a week during the day time. Monday to Friday. and who have a car that is comprehensively insured and suitable for carrying an elderly person. In return we will cover your petrol cost from home (currently we pay 45p per mile). Some of our driver currently work shifts and can only offer 1 or part of a day per week but even this amount of time can help us. You can choose what hours/days you are available and what duties you undertake.

### **BEFRIENDERS REQUIRED**

Would you have an hour a week free in the daytime (Monday to Friday)? Many elderly people would love to have someone to come and see them for a cup of tea and a chat. You could be the first person they see that week who has time just for them! You will gain great satisfaction and help them to relieve their loneliness. We try to find you someone who lives near to you so that if you do not have your own transport, you can walk to them. But if you have to use your car or public transport we will reimburse your costs.

We need people who have time and patience and like talking to elderly people. You need to have good listening skills and be able to show empathy. We will provide you with training and support and match you with one of our clients. Our befriending co-ordinator will take you to your first meeting with our client and support you as necessary.

### County Councillor Report and Popley West: This will be the final Councillor report as Paul

and I say goodbye as Popley Councillors after 45 years of service between us and a further 20 years as a County Councillor. We can assure you it was not what we wanted and it would have been nice to have been able to choose when we retire. As we look back from 1998 when I was first elected, Popley was very different and we have worked with many other Councillors as they came and went. What did we achieve? Some of our highlights are The regeneration of Popley: new homes including Marnel Park, Merton Rise, Spiers Meadow, Everest, Glaziers and Austen Court. The final of the six phases is drawing near and soon there will be new shops opening too. For education we have seen Everest Community Academy, extensions to all our primary schools and a brand new SEN school, Austen Academy. We campaigned and got Abbey Road Post Office reinstated with Dev and Nayna, and a few years before we did the same with the pharmacy. One of the latest campaigns was to save Chineham library that many of our Popley families students and our older generation used. We have seen and been involved in the building of care homes, Marnel Lodge being the latest one. Community facilities included the refurbishment and upgrading of all the community centres: Popley Fields, Bermuda Hall, Melrose Hall and St Gabriel's Church, Marnell Bowl, Base 2000 the Scout headquarters and, with the help of more \$106 money, the upgrading of all the play areas, and worked with all the Councillors for the Splash Pad. But you won't be surprised that the jewel in the crown is Popley Community Park that took 45 years from when we first started campaigning for the then wasteland, that was used as a dumping ground and the council used it to burn branches etc, to be a family park for all ages and abilities. It is just about be finished at the same time as

we are. We have dealt with parking issues; still a long **Popley East:** This will be our last contribution prior to a new path from Tintern Close to the bus stop. We raised over orty four thousand pounds and were able to financially help fifty three local groups and charities. What can we say about Popley Matters? May, will be the final copy of Popley Matters as Paul will be concentrating on a new career. Popley Matters has seen its highs and lows and all too often gone into debt but we propped it up and kept it going and can proudly say there has been a Popley Matters without any gaps. The whole family has been committed to Popley from the first day we moved into Abbey Road in January 1971 and Ken's final thoughts were "Look after Popley". ### Probus Hears about Communist Czechoslovakia

Prague, capital of today's Czech Republic, is a popular tourist destination. Few western tourists were seen forty years ago when Probus Club member, Paul Flint, became a regular visitor over the following twelve years.

Czechoslovakia was part of the Eastern Bloc controlled by the Soviet Union. The 1968 Prague Spring, led by Alexander Dubcek,

was overwhelmed by Warsaw Pact troops as protection against imagined invasions by NATO.

Democracy started in late 1989 with the Velvet Revolution, led by playwright Vaclav Havel. 73,000 Russian troops departed.

At Prague airport, if it proved that money had been exchanged on the black-market, any goods were seized and any Czech Crowns confiscated. Special shops had western goods that could only be bought with hard currency – no questions asked.

Meetings in Prague were with a trading house, my company being their UK venture partner for selling and servicing Czechoslovak made printing presses.

European dealer meetings were held at the factory near to Brno, in the south of the country. To entertain their guests, trips were made to glass engravers and vineyards which produced some excellent wines and champagne style products.

Once we collected a rental car from Vienna airport and drove to Brno. One day we were stopped by a Russian soldier aiming a machine gun. Fortunately, we had with us a lady from the trading company who spoke Russian, but I wondered what might have happened to us if we had been on our own.

Representatives from the manufacturers and trading company visited the UK annually. Despite being forbidden for them to be entertained, we saw many West End musicals and dined well.

There was substantial investment by western companies in Czechoslovak businesses with the most well-known being the takeover of Skoda by Volkswagen. As the owner of two Skoda cars over the last six years I can certify their reliability and quality. The Velvet Revolution worked.

### And our indoor groups get ready too



Samaritans have been a presence in Basingstoke since 1969 and have been offering emotional support to the town and beyond from the early 1970s from our base in Essex Road.

Samaritans is a unique charity dedicated to reducing the feelings of isolation and disconnection that can lead to poor mental health, and in the saddest cases, to suicide. Every six seconds someone contacts us, every six seconds we can help someone turn their life around; our listening volunteers can make a real difference to someone's future.

Our brilliant volunteers took over 19,835 contacts from callers and gave over **3,016 volunteer hours last year.** Every person supporting Basingstoke Samaritans is a volunteer.

Along with supporting callers by phone, email and face to face, we also have strong Outreach Teams supporting our Community. These teams support our schools and colleges, the railway station, give talks to Groups, distribute literature to GP surgeries, our hospital, libraries and CAB and organise events in shops and supermarkets raising awareness and fundraising.

Like all Samaritans branches, Basingstoke is completely self-funded with donations from members of the public and organisations that choose to support us.

We are always looking for new members and all volunteers receive full training in preparation for the kinds of conversations we have. New volunteers are initially supported by an experienced mentor, offering experience to ensure we are doing the right thing for our callers. If listening isn't for you, we also have several support roles to help our branch function.

In the Basingstoke area we continue to receive reports that people's cars are being broken into, tampered with or stolen. As a result we would like to keep residents up to date with relevant crime prevention advice, so that you have a better awareness of how you may protect yourself and your belongings.

Remember – most of these offences are opportunist in nature – by taking even simple precautions you can greatly reduce your likelihood of becoming a victim.

• When leaving your car, close all windows and lock your car. This is the best way to protect your belongings.

• Upon locking your vehicle try your car door to ensure it is actually locked!

Take all your personal possessions with you and do not leave items on display.

· Even items of little value, such as shopping bags and clothing, may tempt a potential thief to break into the vehicle to see whether they contain anything worth stealing. They may even be tempted by such things as coins for the car park, sunglasses, packs of medication or other items that can earn quick cash.

 If your car does not already have an alarm or immobiliser, consider having a Thatcham approved product fitted.

 Keep your car keys away from any windows and doors to prevent them from being "fished" through letterboxes, or seen by opportunist thieves.

Ensure that your front door is locked correctly (lift handle and turn the key if UPVC door).

If keys have been taken, change car locks immediately.

 Register your possessions for free at www.immobilise.com – in doing so you will assist the police in returning your property should it be lost or stolen.

 Secure your number plates with tamper-resistant screws. The easiest way to change the identity of a stolen vehicle or avoid speeding tickets and parking tickets is to fit stolen number plates. Using security screws to attach your vehicle's number plates makes it harder for thieves to get your number.

• Fit locking, anti-tamper wheel nuts to secure alloy wheels. Stolen wheels are valuable, either as parts or for their scrap value. Using locking wheel nuts reduces the risk of your vehicle's wheels being stolen.

· Secure anything that's on the outside of your vehicle. Anything left on roof-racks, tailgate racks, holiday top boxes or in tool chests are easily stolen when the vehicle is parked. The use of cable locks, padlocks and self-locking tools chests, which are secured to the vehicle, makes them more secure, but still, don't leave things in them if you can avoid it.

 Report all suspicious activity or offences to the police. Even if we cannot take immediate action it well help us build a better picture of the issue which will help us combat it more effectively in the long-run.

### Property Disputes Involving Unmarried Couples

As more and more people choose to live together rather than marry, there has been an increase in the number of disputes between separating couples.

One of the biggest issues for these people is their interest in and right to occupy the home they had previously lived in as a couple. Other situations can also involve inherited property and property purchased for investment.

Many people do not realise that unmarried cohabiting couples do not have the same amount of legal protection as those who are married.

While property disputes can be complicated, Simon Arneaud, who is an experienced dispute resolution solicitor, is on hand to help you.

"Property ownership disputes are often governed by a piece of legislation called The Trusts of Land and Appointment of Trustees Act 1996 – often known as TOLATA for short," explained Simon.

TOLATA gives the Court the power to determine what share of the property each person is entitled to. It can force the sale of a property and it can make an order where one person refuses to leave the property but allows the other to regain access.


"If the property is owned in joint names the Court's starting point will usually be, unless one party can provide compelling evidence such as, for example, a signed agreement, to order that the sale proceeds for that property should be divided in equal shares," said Simon.

"In circumstances where a person says they are entitled to a greater than 50% share, despite the property being held as joint tenants, it will be up to that person to prove why they are entitled to a greater share."

"When a property is in one person's name the court will generally state that they are the sole owner. However, the non-owning person may still be able to establish an interest in the property, if it can be shown that the couple shared a common intention that the property would be jointly owned."

European Union citizens living in Basingstoke and Deane are being encouraged to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme before the deadline of 30 June 2021.

Following the UK's departure from the European Union, European citizens living in the UK are required to apply to the scheme to continue living, working and studying in the UK after 30 June.

More than 9,000 residents across the borough have successfully applied to the scheme.

Help and support to apply for the scheme is available locally through Citizens Advice Basingstoke and Tadley. Other support the charity will provide includes guidance on employment rights and EU employees' rights to stay, UK citizens living overseas and looking to return and consumer concerns such as travel insurance.

As well as help and support from Citizens Advice, digital assistance is available for residents who do not have the access, skills or confidence to complete the online form by appointment. To arrange an appointment, please call We Are Digital on 03333 445675.

Leader of Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council Cllr Ken Rhatigan said: "With the deadline to apply fast approaching, it is really important that eligible residents apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to ensure they can stay living in the borough.

"We know this is a difficult time for residents and we are working closely with our partners to support residents to ensure they have everything they need to complete their application."



### Tintern Close to the Bus Stop and Improvement to the T Junction at Abbey Road

Paul and I are excited to be able to report after a lot of meetings and emails that:-

Improvements at Abbey Road junction with Popley Way, by way of a central pedestrian island crossing point and a new footway connection. The feasibility proposal was for a crossing point between the Abbey Road junction and the hotel access, near an existing traffic island, to relocate the central island on Popley Way to the north of the Abbey Road junction instead. This avoided cutting areas of existing verge with new sections of footway, and also allowed us to avoid the need to divert high-voltage electrical services. The proposal, therefore, is a new central island just to the north of Abbey Road junction to allow pedestrian access to the Popley Way footway. This is inclusive of localised carriageway widening to get a sufficient width of central island in. For improved continuity/connectivity we also propose widening the Popley Way footpath to the north of this to be 3 metres shared use path, to match the existing shared use pedestrian and cycle path which ends at the access to the park approximately 50 metres to the north of this point. A new section of footway from Tintern Close to the bus stop approximately 50 metres to the south, along the east side of Popley Way. This links Tintern Close with the bus facilities and crossing point to the park. Note that to deliver this element, we needed to build some areas of the path on land belonging to Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council.



Design work is now concluded on the Abbey Road/Tintern Close pedestrian improvements at the junctions with Popley Way. Please see the draft general arrangement drawings attached. There were some trial holes in the verge on Popley Way to confirm the location of underground utility cables/pipes etc and, following this, we were able to finalise the design details.

Also there were discussions with BDBC with regard to two small areas of BDBC land in the open space to the east of Popley Way that needed to be dedicated as publicly maintainable highway where we can build the new sections of footway.

Tintern Close, the objective was to connect to the nearest bus stop the most practical route also includes a tactile crossing to the opposite side on Tintern Close itself.

### Abbey Road

The junction needed improvements as there had been several minor accidents and the crossing needed improving so the two issues were combined in the final stage and we are pleased to say that the scheme will be done in the summer of this year. It will also make better access for the park. The path will also be widened to match the rest of the pathway and make it suitable for shared use. There will also be a dropped kerb near the Apollo Hotel to make it accessible for all and save walking or driving a buggy in the road.
