Popley Forum

About 40 people attended the second Popley Forum. There were two guest speakers, Blanche Miles, Basingstoke Litter warden and Ian Foley, Highways. They both gave a talk for ten minutes then the audience asked questions these ranged from bins being left out days before collection and Blanche Miles said she would find out who was doing this and write to them. The residents recommended that a letter should be sent to everyone to inform them of the different ways we can dispose of our rubbish. One resident said the bins were not big enough and she was told that families of five or more were entitled to two bins. The lack of leaf clearing was brought up and it was pointed out that it caused a safety problem especially in the winter. Blanche said she would ensure that it would improve, let us know if it doesn't. Another solution suggested was that the council should be more thoughtful self-seeding varieties.

The subject of the poor state of the pavements was discussed and Ian Foley said they were inspected yearly. This was hotly disputed by many people Jane Frankum backed the complaint of Mr. Menday and others that they had been complaining for eighteen months about a pavement that was in a bad condition Jane Frankum challenged Ian Foley to walk around the Popley area with her to see for himself the potholes and uneven surfaces this Ian agreed to do.

Other subjects suggested for further meetings were the lack of policing, increased vandalism, lack of recreational facilities for young people, housing association issues and bus routes and timetables.

In the main arena was a dog show and gymnastic display that attracted a large crowd. The loudest sounds of all were the sirens of all the emergency services that came and gave up their time. Recycling by Boys Brigade

The 6th Basingstoke Company of the Boys' Brigade is really into recycling to help funds.

The Brigade has three large skips at St. Gabriel's Church and one skip at The Soldiers Return Public House in Upper Sherbourne Road. These skips are for newspaper, magazines, glossy, old club books, telephone directories and Thomsons. The skips are emptied every two weeks and the paper goes to Kent to be turned back into newspaper. Usually this takes about two weeks so you could be reading from the same sheet of paper you read from two weeks before.

The money raised stays on Popley to help and support the Boys' Brigade on Popley with regular donations being given to St. Gabriel's Parish Church, Popley. Soon, kerbside collection will start on Popley but more of this from Basingstoke & District Council; but please continue to help us by putting your paper etc into one of our skips on a regular basis.
