
Ian Foley has now put in a bid for five areas of paving to be renewed or repaired as a priority. Waste recycling has now been introduced and Blanche Miles has offered to come to the next meeting and explain how it works.

Telecential green boxes were discussed and there were strong feelings about the poor siting and that the metal boxes were being used as a drum, goal posts and drawn on for cricket stumps. The Forum are to write on the residents behalf and suggest they encase them in durable plastic or better still put them under ground like BT do.

Andrew Cobb chief executive of Oakfern Housing explained how allocation is based upon housing need, the council operates the central register and a new point system is now operating. The association has no control over private dwellings, and that anti-social behaviour is to be firmly clamped down. Conversation rather than confrontation should be seen as a first step before stronger methods are used. Andrew said the real power is with the residents and a way forward is to report problems to the Forum and they would let him know

Wilson June came and talked about Neighbourhood Care Group and said how the group has been formed to promote self-help in the community. Such a project is much needed in the Popley area. People's problems can seem very small but are very important to those concerned and they are often afraid to ask for help, with tasks such as shopping or grass cutting. The project is running in Brighton Hill and Black Dam, and hopefully will start in Popley in the future.

John Blairman (275380) chairman of the Crime Prevention Panel gave a brief talk on people needing to be more aware, Ask for identification from callers at the door. He is available if you would like to set up a Neighbourhood Watch.
