

### Electrical Safety.

Indoor Appliances:

In most homes today you will find an array of electrical equipment such as televisions, stereos, games consoles and computers.

If electrical items are not designed to be left switched on (Such as fridge/freezers), always switch them off and unplug them last thing at night.

Do not overload electrical sockets and ensure that all plugs are fitted with the correctly rated fuse.

#### Garden Appliances:

- When buying electrical garden (or DIY) tools, look for the kite mark.
- Check cables and flexes regularly for frays and kinks.
- Check plugs to make sure they are firmly wired and not damaged.
- Replace damaged flex or plugs.
- Use a residual current device (RCD) or power breaker on all appliances.
- ✓ Fully unwind extension leads before use.

#### If you experience a power cut:

Keep a battery operated light or torch with fresh batteries in a place where you can reach it easily.

Turn off your electrical appliances and lights, but leave one light switched on so you know when the power is back on.

Remember that smoke alarm systems will probably not work unless they have a battery back-up.

Food in the freezer should keep for about eight hours without power.

### Flagship development launched in Popley Islands

Many of you will have noticed that demolition has started in Faroe Close and Maldive Road. Hughes Salvidge started by stripping out the insides of the blocks and full demolition began in April. They're aiming to demolish one block per week, and should be complete by mid June. We're thinking green and recycling 80% of all material. Wood, metal, plasterboard and masonry are all separated and all masonry will be crushed and used as hard core for the new foundations.

The actual development site combines land created from the demolition of the maisonettes in Faroe Close and Maldive Road, some open space between Ascension Close and Cayman Close and the area adjacent to Madeira Close shops and the Barbican Public House. The first new homes should be complete in January 2011 they'll be much more energy efficient, and the new road layout and footpaths will make it much easier to get about.

We'll keep you up to date with progress in future editions of Popley Matters and will be installing a notice board next to the shops in Madeira Close to help keep local residents informed.

#### Dear Friends

Hope you all had a great Easter break and wasn't the weather absolutely splendid! Spring is at last sprung – though there is an old country saying "ne'er cast a clout til' May is out" but its wonderful to see the trees in bud and the daffodils and tulips flowering. It kind of stirs the senses to want to start doing things like spring cleaning, gardening or that DIY project that's been waiting since last year.

I have a problem with this! I have an intense dislike of gardening. I'm no Alan Titchmarsh and every time I try to follow his, and any other number of so-called gardening experts advice, somehow it never seems to look as good as theirs. Same with DIY! ## Beware bogus offers to get debt written off

the charity for your community

Beware of being tempted by advertisements offering to wipe out all of your debts. A growing number of companies are making advertising claims which suggest they can successfully get your debts written off and win compensation by challenging credit card and loan companies over whether some credit agreements can legally be enforced.

Misleading claims wrongly suggest that the vast majority of credit agreements are unenforceable, that credit cards can be written off within a few weeks, that a positive outcome is guaranteed, and that the company can write off all outstanding debts, get all previous payments returned, and allow you to keep any goods purchased. Some advertising suggests wrongly that it costs nothing to make a claim.

A rash of such advertising has recently appeared in newspapers and on the internet.

The firms typically charge around £500 up front to check one credit agreement, with no guarantee that they will be able to make a successful challenge. Where people have several debts, the fees can quickly mount up to several thousands of pounds and people may then be sold a 'no win, no fee' agreement to take legal action that can cost them even more.

These ads appear to offer an easy way out to people who have credit debts they are struggling to pay. But many credit agreements do meet the legal requirements and therefore can't easily be challenged as unenforceable.

The CAB provides free, confidential, independent and expert advice that can help you handle your debts, and a CAB adviser can check for free if there may be genuine grounds for a challenge.

#### Funding to help residents to make a difference

Make a difference to your neighbourhood ? that?s the message from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council as it encourages residents to apply for funding to improve their local areas.



The council has a ?50,000 fund to help improve the quality of the local environment and residents are being asked to put forward their suggestions for areas in need of improvement.

Areas that could qualify will have nuisance issues affecting the quality of life of residents and will also need to improve the local environment. 

regarding winter resilience / difficulties encountered during the recent cold weather have been submitted to both HCC and BDBC. We have focussed on

the unacceptable time it took to get snow ploughs on to the smaller roads in the Village. In the meantime, we have requested extra salt grit bins at targeted locations.

Greening Campaign. The launch of the Greening Campaign was held on the 27th April. Did you attend? - we hope so! If not, ask your friends and make sure you get up to speed with this exciting Village initiative, helping the environment and saving money.

Bus Services. The No.56 bus service has been terminated by Steventon Coaches. Hampshire CC is organising a car share / taxi service. More details to follow. The Parish Council has also asked whether the No.2 bus can divert through the Village once per hour - although this has not been agreed previously. Meanwhile a request from bus-users to drivers parking at the Village Hall - Please don't park so you block access to the bus stop shelter.

Marnell Park / Merton Rise. The Parish Council will ask Basingstoke & Deane to commence a consultation process to consider the future boundaries / composition of Sherborne St John (Civil) Parish. If Basingstoke & Deane agrees, the first indication for residents will be a questionnaire from BDBC – which you should complete and return. This is the same process we previously completed with Rooksdown.

Allotments. Rent for the forthcoming year will be unchanged – at £20 per annum for allotments with water supply, £12.50 per annum where there is no supply. This means an increase at Sunnyside where a supply has been installed.

Damage Accidents. There is an increasing frequency of minor accidents involving damage to road signs and street furniture. Normally, the drivers of the vehicles don't bother to report the damage / admit liability. This means that we have to pay for the repairs! If you see a damage incident please take down the registration number and pass it to the Clerk and/or our local Community police team led by WPC Miriam Edwards.

Question Is peace and goodwill possible for warring couples?

Dear residents, We hope you are well and are enjoying the nice weather we are receiving. Please take the time to read the reports below regarding the work your Safer Neighbourhoods team have done over the Easter period. **Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel (PSNP) priorities update:** 

The following issues were raised as core priorities for your area by the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Panel (PSNP). We have included a brief update on the work we are currently doing with regards to these priorities.

#### Potential ASB around the Faroe/Maldive re-development site:

The Issue was raised as a PSNP core priority due to the concern members and residents had of potential Anti-Social behaviour around the new redevelopment area of Faroe Close/Maldive Road. The Popley Beat Team have increased our patrols in the area in order to prevent entry to the site. PCSO DANKS has liaised with the developers at the site and conducted local school assemblies in order to educate the children of the Dangers involved with playing on the building sites.

#### Dog fouling in the Popley play parks:

The issue of dog fouling was raised by residents at beat surgeries conducted throughout February as a potential PSNP priority. In March the issue was voted a priority by PSNP panel members. The Popley Beat Team will soon be distributing dog waste "Scoop-a-boxes" which is a device enabling you to carry a small packet which folds out in to a scooping dog waste box. These items will be placed inside the local community centres of Popley and available at beat surgeries. These items will be free to residents.

#### ASB Mallory Close / Bourdillon Gardens / Edmund Court:

The issue of anti-social behaviour at the above locations was raised by residents and panel members after the increase of calls received by residents regarding this. The Popley Beat Team have increased our patrols of the area and identified several suspects who have been causing this disruptive behaviour. These suspects are currently being dealt with in order that the issues of ASB do not re-occur. The Popley Beat Team and are partner agencies are continuing to liaise with residents regarding these issues.

#### **Other news:**

Dog issues have featured high on the teams agenda in recent times. Many dogs are used as status symbols and can appear intimidating to members of the public. The Popley SNT are currently investigating a savage dog-on-dog attack in Popley West.

As the weather improves we are getting more reports of motorbikes in Carpenters Down Woods. If you are witness to this please can you note as much detail as possible to enable the Beat Team to identify the riders.

On 13th April 2010 a 13 year old female was walking home from Oakridge, Basingstoke. When she was near to Marnel School on Shetland Road, Popley a male approached her in a vehicle. The male stated to the teenager "DO YOU WANT A LIFT LOVE?". The teenager said nothing in reply and kept walking. The male never followed her. The male was described as mixed race and aged approx 45 years old. The male had a foreign sounding voice and looked tall and stocky. The male drove a modern looking dark green people carrier. The car was possibly a Vauxhall Zafira. The Popley Beat Team are dedicated to ensuring the safety of the community and would like to speak to the male to assertain his motives.

On 20th April 2010 the Popley Safer Neighbourhoods Team attended the "Popley Islands Regeneration Project-official start on site demolition event" The Popley SNT will continue to monitor the site to ensure public safety as the work continues.


- Qualification for the Senior Europa Cup League Team
